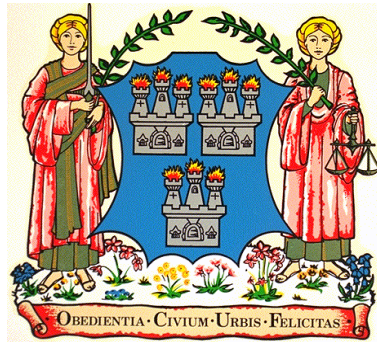

25. Submitted Report No. 198/2011 of the Central Area Joint Policing Committee – Breviate of the meeting held on 13th June 2011 – *Councillor Mary Fitzpatrick, Chairperson*. . It was proposed by Councillor C Burke and seconded by Councillor R McAdam “That Dublin City Council notes the contents of Report No198/2011“ The motion was put and carried.
26. It was proposed by Councillor C Burke and seconded by L O’Toole “That this City Council calls on the Minister for Transport in light of the Primetime programme shown on Monday, 16th May regarding rogue taxi drivers, that extra enforcement officers be employed to remove such breaches in the taxi trade and that checks take place on taxi drivers to remove drivers who do not have PSV badges” The motion was put and carried.
27. It was proposed by Councillor L O’Toole “That this Council supports the Irish Peace Movement’s campaign to terminate the use of Shannon Airport by US troops on their way to and from the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq”. An addition/amendment to this motion was proposed by Councillor J Horgan-Jones and seconded by Councillor P Bourke. The amended motion, as follows, was then put and carried - “That this Council supports the Irish Peace Movement’s campaign to terminate the use of Shannon Airport by US troops on their way to and from the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq and calls for Shannon Airport to be established as an international hub for the storage and distribution of emergency humanitarian supplies as outlined in the Programme for Government ”
28. It was proposed by Councillor R McGinley and seconded by Councillor P Bourke “That the Manager examines all interfaces that the Planning Department has with businesses in the city for planning and licensing purposes with a view to streamlining procedures, and increasing responsiveness to business needs” An amendment was proposed by Councillor P Dunne and seconded by Councillor M Flynn – to add the word ‘communities’ in after businesses. The amended motion, as follows, was then put and carried - “That the Manager examines all interfaces that the Planning Department has with businesses and communities in the city for planning and licensing purposes with a view to streamlining procedures, and increasing responsiveness to business and community needs”
29. It was proposed by Councillor M Flynn and seconded by Councillor C Ni Dhalaigh “That the City Manager, on account of the fact that many of the dwellings at Dolphins House flat complex and other such Dublin City Council Social Housing Units throughout the DCC area are in such a state of bad repair, sub-standard and unfit for habitation that a rent reduction on such dwellings would be introduced immediately in order to relieve the hardship caused by living in such inhumane conditions. That consideration be given to giving tenants of such dwellings rent credits and, where there are outstanding arrears, that the arrears be reduced. This is all in the interest of good relations between landlord and tenant and best practice in relation to customer services” The motion was put to a vote and defeated.
30. The City Council agreed that the following motion, standing at Item No 41 on the Agenda Paper in the name of Councillor M Freehill, would be deferred until the next monthly meeting of the City Council to be held on the 5th September “That Dublin City Council agrees to implement a policy of providing a Bill Board at all maintenance and works sites outlining the actual monetary cost of the contract and a summary of the works schedule. The impact of this policy will be that the

Council shows greater transparency and informs the citizen of the actual cost of local works so that they, in turn, can see how their taxes are being spent e.g. repair of ramps, public lighting, removal of graffiti etc.”

31. It was proposed by Councillor D Heney and seconded by Councillor L O'Toole “That the Manager now arranges to honour the previous commitment of Dublin City Council management to complete the granite facing of the Port Tunnel wall up as far as the traffic lights at Whitehall, Dublin 9” The motion was put and carried. The City Manager informed the City Council that this item would be considered during the formulation of next year’s budget.
32. It was proposed by Councillor P Dunne and seconded by Councillor P Bourke “That Dublin City Council notes:
- a. That the Duffy/Walsh Report to the Minister for Enterprise, Employment and Innovation concludes *inter alia* : “We have concluded that lowering the basic JLC rates to the level of the minimum wage rate is unlikely to have a substantial effect on employment.” And “ we conclude that it is not accurate to suggest that the body of primary employment rights legislation currently in force adequately covers matters dealt with by ERO’s and REA’s.”
 - b. That reduction in the remuneration of already lowly paid employees will result in a reduction in revenue to the state through PAYE and VAT.
 - c. That any reduction in remuneration to employees covered by JLC’s and ERO’s will transfer income from the lowly paid to employers.
 - d. That any reduction in remuneration to affected employees who spend almost their entire income in Ireland will reduce demand in the economy and accelerate the elimination of jobs caused by the policies of the previous government and the support by the current government for the measures contained in Budget 2011.
 - e. That it is this reduction in demand in the economy that is destroying jobs not JLC/ERO rates.
 - f. That any provision for derogation from JLC and ERO rates of remuneration in individual employments is likely to lead to a collapse of the system as a whole and the reduction of already low wages generally, further reduction in demand and increased job elimination in the economy as a whole.
 - g. That the Employment Research Centre in Trinity College has stated that Employment Regulation Orders help create jobs because they make it difficult for employers to use ‘zero hour’ contracts.

Dublin City Council deplores the proposals of Minister Bruton to enact the following measures:

- Reduction or abolition of extra pay for working unsocial hours on Sunday. At the moment, many workers get paid at time and a third, or double time if they are on overtime.
- Allow employers to claim ‘an inability to pay’. So instead of a security worker getting €10.01 an hour which is what their JLC specifies – they could be cut back to the bare minimum wage.
- Reduce overtime rates.
- Remove protection for young workers under 18.
- Reduce the number of Employment Regulation Orders and end coverage of working conditions such as sick pay.
- Allow employers not to keep proper records about which workers were employed at certain hours which would make it easier to evade the law.

Dublin City Council calls on the government to abandon these measures” An addition/amendment to this motion was proposed by Councillor B McDowell and seconded by Councillor O Quinn as follows - “and supports the implementation of the full Duffy Walsh Report” The full amended motion was put and carried.

33. The City Council agreed that a report be sent to Councillor E Costello on the following motion, standing in her name at Item No 44 on the Agenda Paper - “That the Manager report on the number and location of emergency beds available for homeless in the City, the number of these beds available to the Night Bus and the number of sleeping bags being distributed by the Night Bus per week, and explains why the Night Bus is now offering sleeping bags rather than providing accommodation”
34. It was proposed by Lord Mayor Andrew Montague and seconded by Councillor C Ni Dhalaigh “That the Manager re-opens the recycling/Bring Centres on Saturdays and Sundays to facilitate members of the public that cannot access the Bring Centres during the week” Assistant City Manager, Mr Seamus Lyons, outlined the position in relation to financial constraints and staffing requirements to open these centres at weekends. The Lord Mayor and City Council agreed to note this report.
35. The City Council agreed that a report be sent to Councillor M Metcalfe on the following motion, standing in her name at Item No 46 on the Agenda Paper - “Will the City Manager inform me of the number of cases waiting for (a) ramps and (b) extensions under the scheme for persons with disabilities”
36. The City Council agreed that a report be sent to Councillor E Wynne on the following motion, standing in her name at Item No 47 on the Agenda Paper - “That this Council calls for a review of parking on bus lanes on Saturdays. There is little commuter traffic on Saturdays and the ban on parking in bus lanes and clearways on Saturdays is doing untold damage to already struggling urban village businesses”
37. The following motion, standing in the name of Councillor N Ring at Item No 47 on the Agenda Paper, was deemed to have fallen due to his absence from the meeting “That the Members of Dublin City Council instruct the City Manager to immediately arrange, co-ordinate and set up a meeting with officials of Dublin City Council Housing Department, the Gardaí, the Minister for Housing and Local Services or his officials, the Minister for Social Protection or her officials, the Minister for Justice or his officials, Health Service Executive Officials, Revenue Officials, representatives of Private Residential Tenancies Board (PRTB) and any other interested parties, with a view to an all-agency approach being taken to ensure that the letting of properties in the city is regulated to the highest standard, benefitting the tenants, landlords and the local residents alike, and that agreed criteria, controls and procedures are put in place and implemented to ensure that all current available legislation is utilised and enforced to ensure that property lettings attain the highest standards practicable, and to discourage exploitation of tenants, mismanagement of properties and inconvenience, disruption and upset of local residents”
38. The City Council agreed that the following motion, standing at Item No 49 on the Agenda Paper in the name of Councillor T Brabazon, would be deferred until the next monthly meeting of the City Council to be held on the 5th September “That Dublin City Council does not renege on their commitment given to St. Malachy’s

FC Edenmore to provide matching funding for the amount of €50,000 a number of years ago given by manager's order upon which the club have relied in advancing their development plans and this Council calls upon the Manager to pay out these funds immediately to the club as promised"

39. It was proposed by Councillor P McCartan and seconded by Councillor K Binchy "That this Council fully supports the Minister for Arts, Jimmy Deenihan, in his endeavours to acquire the Bank of Ireland Building on College Green and to return it to state ownership in recognition of the massive financial support Bank of Ireland has received from the taxpayer. The building can then be converted into a centre celebrating Dublin's literary heritage" The motion was put and carried.
40. The City Council agreed that a report be sent to Councillor S Wrenn on the following motion, standing in his name at Item No 53 on the Agenda Paper - "That the Manager considers a scheme for the estimated 500 cars impounded annually, of which around half are scrapped at a cost of €250; if a scheme could be devised to distribute these cars to Fas Training Schemes for apprentice mechanics to practice on or be given to the Fire Brigade for emergency training or some other worthwhile use that would be a more productive use than scrappage"

The meeting concluded at 10pm in accordance with Standing Orders and all items remaining on the Agenda were deferred to the next meeting of the City Council to be held on the 5th September 2011.
