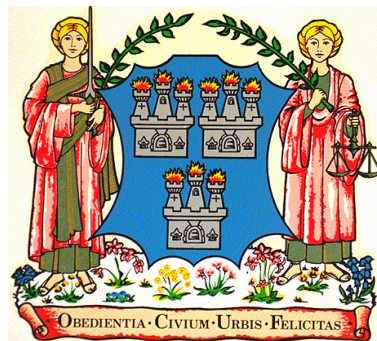


COMHAIRLE CATHRACH BHAILE ÁTHA CLIATH

1. Outgoing Lord Mayor Gerry Breen, opening the meeting, thanked the City Manager and his staff, particularly the staff of the Mansion House, for their help and support for the past year. He then called for Nominations for Lord Mayor for the forthcoming year.

Councillor Paddy Bourke said that before making a nomination, he would like to congratulate the outgoing Lord Mayor on the very special year he had as Lord Mayor, incorporating as it did the historic visits of Prince Albert of Monaco, Queen Elizabeth II and President Barak Obama of the United States. He hoped that these visits would

showcase Ireland, particularly Dublin, to the world and in so doing would result in an increase in the number of tourists coming to this country.

He thanked the outgoing Lady Mayoress for her support of the Lord Mayor over the past year. It was then moved by Cllr. P Bourke and seconded by Cllr. B Tormey "That Councillor Andrew Montague is proposed for the office of Lord Mayor of the City of Dublin for the period 27th June, 2011 to continue in such office (subject to his death, resignation, disqualification, removal from office or otherwise ceasing to be a member of the City Council) until his successor shall have been elected at the Annual Meeting of the City Council in 2012".

It was moved by Cllr. V Jackson and seconded by Cllr. C Burke "That Councillor Cieran Perry is proposed for the office of Lord Mayor of the City of Dublin for the period 27th June, 2011 to continue in such office (subject to his death, resignation, disqualification, removal from office or otherwise ceasing to be a member of the City Council) until his successor shall have been elected at the Annual Meeting of the City Council in 2012".

It was moved by Cllr. M Mac Donnacha and seconded by Cllr. C Ni Dhalaigh "That Councillor Larry O'Toole is proposed for the office of Lord Mayor of the City of Dublin for the period 27th June, 2011 to continue in such office (subject to his death, resignation, disqualification, removal from office or otherwise ceasing to be a member of the City Council) until his successor shall have been elected at the Annual Meeting of the City Council in 2012".

A poll was taken – the results were as follows:

Brid Smith is proposed for the office of Deputy Lord Mayor of the City of Dublin for the period 27th June, 2011 to continue in such office (subject to her death, resignation, disqualification, removal from office or otherwise ceasing to be a member of the City Council) until her successor shall have been elected at the Annual Meeting of the City Council in 2012".

She thanked her family for their support, especially her mother who had travelled a long distance to be with her on this special occasion. The new Deputy Lord Mayor was then warmly congratulated by the Lord Mayor, Members, City Manager and staff. Many tributes were paid to the outgoing Lord Mayor and Deputy Lord Mayor and they were both congratulated on the dignity they brought to the offices they held for the past year.
