Thursday 22nd March 2018 at 11.00am

Meet at Palace Street (opposite the Olympia Theatre in Dame Street) at 11.00am. Finish at St. Patrick's Cathedral (you may make an optional visit to the Cathedral). Finish at approximately 12.45pm.

Departure outside the former church, corner Suffolk/Andrew Street (beside Molly Malone statue). Finish on Fishamble Street at approximately 12.40pm.

This is a unique walk to celebrate the premiere of the world-renowned composer, George Frederick Handel's immortal Messiah, which was premiered in Dublin on 13th April, 1742. The tour will take in the major places connected with Handel's stay in Dublin and the amazing first performance of his masterpiece. Our walk will end with the very special annual street performance of Messiah extracts (commencing 1pm).
