



Dublin City Council and their Energy Advisors Codema are working together on an exciting new project called Ace. Ace promotes the importance of renewable energy in everyday life to citizens, businesses, universities and local government, the idea being if the right information is provided there will be an increased uptake of renewable energy.

Currently a lack of co-ordination and sharing of knowledge among various European communities has led to limited success for the renewable energy sector within Europe. Dublin City Council will address this information gap through Ace by informing and educating the public on how to switch from conventional fossil fuels to renewable energy resources.

Ace will support a number of on-the-ground renewable energy case studies being developed. In Dublin City, a Citizens Plaza which promotes renewable energy will be developed in Bernardos Square beside City Hall and will feature an interactive energy feature where members of the public can get information and learn about renewable energy in a non-conventional, fun way. This will also link with Kevin Street Library in Dublin City Centre, which will provide additional and more detailed information in relation to renewable energy for citizens who wish to delve deeper into learning about renewable energy.
