Father Collins Park Public Art

Funding was committed to public art as part of the development of Fr Collins Park. Of this €6,400 was allocated by direct commissioning to Maser, graffiti artist to paint the skateboarding area. A selection process was initiated to commission an artwork for the park. Seven artists were short-listed and Alan Phelan was awarded the commission by unanimous decision of the selection panel. His proposal was for a sculpture.

The sculpture is a large metal framework structure of an inverted oil rig located in the central east lake of the park. The sculpture will rise from the water surface, supported by the inverted top of the derrick. The total height will be approximately 5 metres tall with a support structure for the work hidden below the water level. With further development of the design the water from the park fountain systems will hopefully flow through the work, further activating it as a dynamic sculptural presence in the lake. As an inverted oil drilling platform rig the metaphor or concept is quite simple. The oil rig is notionally returning the oil to the ground. The piece connects to the sustainable design of the park, drawing on the environmental concepts that have informed the park concept and its realisation. Rather than duplicate the strategies used in the park's sustainable design what is proposed is a different metaphor for these concerns. The piece is a logical yet creative response to the alternative energy resource provided by the five wind turbines which dominate the promenade in the park.

The durability and maintenance of the sculpture as well as health and safety issues have been rigorously scrutinised as part of the commissioning process. To facilitate this, the commission was divided into two phases – Phase 1 Research and Development and Phase 2 Fabrication, Transport and Installation.

NEWTOWN TRAVELLERS

A meeting has been held between senior members of An Garda Síochána and DCC regarding the Travellers at Newtown Court. The Gardai indicated that they would be reluctant to forcibly remove the Travellers in the absence of a suitable alternative location being available. Reports from residents regarding alleged anti-social behaviour by the Travellers were also conveyed to the Gardai (speeding cars, stone throwing, intimidation, horses and dogs etc).

DCC proposes to attempt mediation for a final time under a new mediator. It is not anticipated that this will be a lengthy process. It will involve an attempt to ensure that both Traveller families can agree to live in harmony on the St. Dominicks site. Alternatively it will be to ascertain the housing options which would be preferred by the Travellers at Newtown Court. However there is no question of the entire extended family being housed together”.

Dublin City Council has no current proposals for this site

It is (however) noted that there was a number of planning applications for significant redevelopments of the (details supplied) which were ultimately refused by either An Bord Pleanala or Dublin City Council - the last one was decided in October 2008. There is a current application (4076/10 refers) for Alterations to the existing (details supplied) and site to include the provision of a flood defence wall to protect the (details supplied) and link with DCC's proposed Clontarf Flood defences as approved by ABP (reg ref 29N.ja0008). These would be enabling works rather than the actual redevelopment of the (details supplied) themselves.

As soon as the owner of the site is identified, a Warning Letter pursuant to Section 152 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 will issue in respect of the van in use as an advertising structure. Under the Act, the recipient has 4 weeks to respond to the Letter. An inspection will then be carried out and a decision made as to further enforcement action.

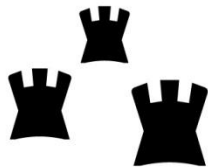

In relation to the ongoing court proceedings and other matters, I am advised that the following is the current situation:

Planning: There are ongoing prosecutions in the District Court with the most recent appearance in court being on the 15th March. The Case has now been adjourned to the 14th of June. There is no further update on this matter

Fire Safety: In respect of a prosecution in relation to fire safety issues at Priory Hall Apartment Block, two persons were convicted on all counts with both receiving fines and suspended sentences. I understand that one of the convicted is appealing and the second party may also appeal. I am instructed that the Fire Officer is seeking further legal advice in relation to this matter.

Building Control: The investigation by the Building Control Section is continuing – as it is a process that may or may not lead to criminal charges, it is not appropriate to comment on the course of the investigation.

Housing Survey:

The building survey commissioned by the Housing Department was due to commence in late March. Permission was sought in writing from the owners of the common areas to carry out opening up works in the common areas. The City Council continue to await this permission. In the interim the consultant has received quotations from contractors to carry out these tests and a company is ready to start as soon as the necessary permissions are in place.

This issue has been developing over the past few years with the increase of students in the area and it would assist residents if the manager could consider a workable solution to this matter."
