REPORT TO OCTOBER NORTH CENTRAL AREA -HALLOWEEN 2013

INTRODUCTION

Dublin City Council in conjunction with the Gardaí and the local community, are committed to making Halloween in the North Central Area a safe and enjoyable bank holiday for all of our citizens. However, despite the many positive elements of the annual Halloween Festival, the period continues to be characterised by serious injury to people, damage to property and anti-social behaviour. Dublin City Council, the Gardaí Síochána, Dublin Fire Brigade, other agencies and community organisations work together to manage and control the risks involved with bonfires and related anti-social behaviour which require considerable resources, both physical and financial.

Removal of Materials

Dublin City Council crews will be active in the North Central Area removing stockpiled debris as follows:

- Crews from Parks Dept Vincent Hughes: with a contractor operating on 30th and 31st
- Enviro Crew on duty for the entire month of October during week days
- Public Domain Crew for the entire month of October during week days and also the week-end.
- ELO on call for the above times.
- Arrangements will be put in place for the clean up operations for the aftermath of the event also.

• Co-operation between Gardaí and Dublin City Council

During the run up to Halloween there is considerable danger to Dublin City Council crews when removing stockpiled debris. The council is grateful to have the co-operation and assistance from the Gardaí in the form of Garda escorts, when requested.

The "Keep it Green this Halloween" campaign will also be regularly discussed and advertised on local community radio NEAR90fm in the run up to Halloween. In particular, appeals will be made to businesses and residents not to stockpile bonfire material which facilitates the destruction of our green spaces and the endangerment of our communities. Emphasis will be placed on health and safety, the environment, and the recycling and reusing of unwanted items. Civic pride, the repeated success of the area in the City Neighbourhoods Competition and the considerable resources that go in to keeping North Central a place to be proud of, will also be emphasised.

- **School Visits, Posters**

By the last week in October, Area Staff will have delivered talks on Halloween to 5th and 6th class students in approximately 25 primary schools from North Central districts including Donaghmede, Darndale, Priorswood, Kilbarrack, Artane, Santry, Fairview and Raheny, using the Green Schools Programme as an effective tool to communicate the following:

- The negative impact that bonfires and illegal fireworks have on the environment, communities, green spaces, property, pets and wildlife.
- Risk of serious injuries to those making and attending bonfires & using illegal fireworks.
- The risk to the emergency services attending bonfires i.e., the Fire Brigade & Ambulance service, Gardaí, DCC, and also local the community.
- The waste of financial resources used on the clean up prior to and after Halloween
- The promotion and encouragement of safe alternatives – Dublin City Council official fireworks displays and parties in schools and local community halls.

The Halloween poster with the “Keep it Green this Halloween” theme has also been delivered to the schools in the area and is advertised on the website.

- Written to Local businesses requesting that flammable material is carefully stored away during Halloween period

- **Firework displays & Events – locations and times**

To provide the community with a safe alternative to bonfires and illegal fire works, official fireworks displays and events have been planned by Dublin City Council in association with local community groups for Halloween night 31st October – **please note however, that these may be subject to change.**

- **Darndale Park**- *Fire Works display (run in conjunction with Darndale Belcamp Resource Centre, Sphere 17, Jigsaw & the New Life Centre)- 6.00 pm*
- **Kilbarrack** - *Fire Works display, Roseglan Football Pitch (run in conjunction with the Kilbarrack Coast Community Programme KCCP) – 7.00 p.m.*
- **Donaghmede Park** – *Fire Works display (run in conjunction with the Donaghmede Estate Residents Association) –7.30 p.m.*
- **Edenmore Crescent Park** - *Fire Works display (run in conjunction with the Safety Association for Edenmore SAFE) – 8.00 p.m.*

- **Appeal to Community Groups and Businesses**

Letters will be sent from the Area Office to local community groups and businesses, appealing for the assistance in the “Keep it Green this Halloween” campaign and advising them of their obligations under the Litter pollution Act 1997, where they can be fined up to €150 or prosecuted up to €3000 for leaving material unsecured and available for use in bonfires. This appeal will also be made on Nearfm as above.
