Update on Barnmore relocation in Coolock Industrial Estate

The Companies Registration Office records indicate that the Barnmore Group's registered address is Unit 7b, Newtown Park, Malahide Road Industrial Estate, Coolock, Dublin 17. Office accommodation at Unit 7B is used by Barnmore and their operations are independent of Northside Recycling.

The Waste Enforcement Unit carries out regular inspections of the Northside Recycling facility, the most recent inspection being 17/02/2014.

Validation of Northside Recycling's statutory Annual Return under its waste facility permit and its waste collection permit has commenced.

Validation of Barnmore's statutory Annual Return under its waste collection permit is also being carried out by DCC Waste Enforcement Officers.

Re: Speed Attenuation measures Clontarf Cycle

Following discussions with the National Transport Authority, the Consultant commissioned to design the S2S Cycle and Pedestrian scheme has been retained to prepare a proposal for speed management measures on the route. To date the Consultant has identified a speed profile based on the Dutch Design Manual for Bicycle traffic. While this may form the basis for the solution, the technical, safety and compliance merits of proposal are under review by the Traffic Department. Subject to all the technical and safety merits being met, the proposal will be forwarded to the NTA with a recommendation. On the basis of proposal presented at the moment, the resolution of the technical issues may take a few months.

With reference to a proposal to initiate the procedure for the extinguishment of the Public Right of Way over laneway to the rear of 80–118 Collins Avenue and 25-59 Collins Park, Donnycarney, Dublin 9.

Proposal

A request to have the public right of way extinguished over the laneway to the rear of 80-118 Collins Avenue and 25-59 Collins Park was received from the Residents. The reason for the closure is to prevent anti-social behaviour. The proposed method of closure is by means of lockable gates. The extent of the proposed extinguishment is shown on Drawing No RM 26293 (copy attached).

Service Checks

A service check has been initiated.

Statutory Requirement

The statutory procedure involves giving public notice of the proposal in one or more newspapers circulating in the City and the affixing of that notice at each end of the right of way for a period of not less than 14 days. Any objections or representations made and not withdrawn shall be considered. The extinguishment of a public right of way is a function reserved to the elected members of the City Council.

Recommendation

I recommend that procedures be initiated under Section 73 of the Roads Act 1993 to extinguish the public right of way over the area indicated on Drawing No. RM 26293.

NORTH CENTRAL AREA COMMITTEE APRIL 2014 FAIRVIEW REVIEW & POTENTIAL IMPROVEMENT PLANS

To the Members of the Area Committee
North Central Area

Background

Fairview and Marino are well known and established parts of the city. There has been recent public investment notably in the park and the installation of a new footbridge.

For several years, the North Central Area Office has provided a DCC/Fairview Business Forum while in tandem its Community Development Section has supported the Fairview and Marino Residents Associations.

Mindful of the physical enhancements and the good relationships, it was considered a suitable area for a planned public realm plan or local environment improvement plan.

Such a plan would provide for a structured approach to planning improvements in a transparent and resourced manner.

Guiding Planning Principles and consistency Dublin Development Plan

The Department of Environment, Community and Local Government (DECLG) issued updated Guidelines for Planning Authorities in June 2013. The Guidelines state that statutory Local Area Plans are designed to provide more detailed planning policy under the Development Plan, where significant development and change is anticipated.

There are, however, many established areas of Dublin City, typically centred on urban villages, where a statutory LAP is not the most appropriate mechanism to improve and enhance them. In such circumstances, the DECLG guidance indicates that documents, such as Local Environmental Improvement Plans, may be drawn up, provided they are consistent with the parameters laid down by statutory plans, such as the Development Plan.

Boundary

The area is bounded by the Tolka river, and Fairview park, west to Malahide Rd, north to Griffith Avenue and east to Phillipsburgh Avenue. It will include Fairview Strand and Annesly Bridge Road.

HIGH LEVEL OBJECTIVES

The main objectives are :

- 1) Incremental improvements to Public Realm
- 2) Counter impact of traffic, illegal parking and related issues
- 3) DCC initiatives – waste management, apps, community development
- 4) Business and Cultural initiatives – The Heritage Trail and Shop local emphasis

The favoured implementation is one of incremental social and physical gain while improvements would be tangible and cumulative over the short to medium term.

RESEARCHING A PLAN FOR FUTURE IMPROVEMENTS

The North Central Area Office will work with a planner to initially research and analyse the relevant information such as:

- Analysis of current urban design & physical landscape
- User and customer analysis
- Demographic analysis and characteristics
- Accessibility and Mobility analysis
- On- street consultations and stakeholder input

- Consultation with local businesses/residents associations
- Communication with local councillors
- Profile of business and not for profit services e.g. retail, fast food, uniqueness
- Footfall profile
- DCC inputs to include Roads, Traffic , Planning, Parks, Public Domain
- Led by Assistant Area Manager Jim Kelly

POTENTIAL ACTION AREAS IDENTIFIED BUT FOR ASSESSEMENT

1. ROADS and TRAFFIC

Transport issues and opinions are recurring topics for discussion between the local community and the City Council. Potential action areas could include :

- Parking and Access
- Clontarf to Amiens Street cycle track
- Bicycle parking
- Walking Initiatives – localised Apps
- Footbridge
- Street lighting analysis

2. ECONOMIC AND BUSINESS RELATIONSHIPS

While the term village is commonly used for Fairview/ Marino, it is really more akin to a small town with several thousand residences and 90 businesses. This scale means opportunities could be assessed for example and illustration only :

- Branding Fairview – ‘I Love Fairview’
- Festivals Summer and Christmas – strengthening and developing
- Media Near FM – Websites to build relationships
- Retail discounts for locals – Ideas scheme with DCU
- Walk Dublin APP
- Bord Failte discussion – Virtual Heritage Trail
- Digital marketing and in formation
- Park – as asset
- playground and iPlay
- Proximity to Dublin bay and walks
- Sports facilities

History & Culture

- Literary richness
- Lord Claremont’s legacy
- Societies – arts, culture, and history

Sports and Lifestyle

- Rich sporting heritage
- Healthy Lifestyles initiatives – Northside Partnership
- Age Friendly link up
- Linking sports events to business opportunities

Heritage Trail

- Link along the coast – route to Clontarf, St. Anne’s, Bull island, Howth
- Dracula theme – Bram stoker
- Heritage Trail
- Tourist Buses

- Cycle route for tourists/local residents.

3. WASTE MANAGEMENT AND ENVIRONMENTAL INITIATIVES

There is an increasing awareness and demands for improvements in waste management and an appreciation of the benefits of a visually attractive environment for residents and business. There should be scope for actions such as:

- Adopt a Street
- New Bins and Street Furniture
- Flower boxes and hanging baskets
- Compliance checks for domestic refuse service providers
- Clean-ups with community and business groups
- Litter wardens – targeting black spots

HIGH LEVEL OUTPUTS OF THE REVIEW AND LOCAL ENVIRONMENTAL PLAN

There will be an Area Managed structure to assist the review. There will be a across Area Office themes and objectives as outlined above. Optimally there should be a classification of recommendations and action areas over 3 distinct time-frames 3-6 months, b) 7- 12 months, and c) greater than 12 months with targets in relation to :

- Identify and classify planned actions and group within timeframes of 6 months, 6/12 months, greater than 12 months:-
 - General Improvements to Public Realm – physical e.g. bicycle stands, bins, lighting, street furniture, parking, paths (link to planned improvements & Age Friendly)
 - Waste Management & Environmental Initiatives - cluster DCC campaigns e.g. litter, dog fouling, graffiti removal, recycling, utility box painting, WEEE recycling, , adopt a street, cycle or walk to village campaigns
 - Co-ordinate residents/business campaigns e.g. shop local, Branding Fairview, Summer/Christmas Festivals, possible Halloween (Bram Stoker, retail discount schemes, outdoor eating, uniform shop front colours etc, flower baskets, Sli na Slainte
 - Business & cultural initiatives e.g. The Heritage Trail (to include well known Fairview people), map local facilities such as sports, cultural, cafes and restaurants etc.

Good management tool

The plan will provide a robust planned approach rather than a reactive one based on sole issues. There will be terms of reference to assess demands and requests which may arise in an ad-hoc manner. This should provide assurances to councilors, business and community and facilitate effective management of resources (time, finance, personnel, skills and co-ordination with DCC service providers and functional departments.

It is envisaged that the methodology should be flexible to be adapted to other significant locations in North Central. It is planned to have the final report in September/October to Area Committee and in the meantime Area Management are available to assist councilors with matters arising,
