To ask the Area Manager to please refer to the large tree outside (*details supplied*), the roots of which have caused the footpath to crack leaving a hazardous situation for many vulnerable pedestrians living in the locality and say if she can arrange to have the footpath properly reinstated.

 - c. Grass cutting on large play areas not taking place on a regular basis leaving the place left very unkempt. Many residents felt the area maintenance has regressed since the introduction of private operators.

There are steps there however they are only good for people with full mobility.

This is a good example of good quality public space where we need to remove as many cars as possible: the way it now cars have a negative effect on a good quality public space. Residents, rightly so, demand less cars there.

To ask the Area Manager what can be done concerning very low water pressure in public and private houses in the old part of Bluebell (Bluebell Road, Drive and around). Residents would like to have a survey done on private and public dwellings.

There are about 35 houses, one block of apartments with a minimum of six apartments and the Glenaulin nursing home with an occupancy of 87 residents at the end of the cul de sac and the daily traffic of truck delivery and private bus transportation that comes with it and around 27 car parking spaces belonging to the nursing home.

Q48 Councillor Sophie Nicoulaud

To ask the Area Manager to give a statement with regards to asbestos on the site at the old Clayton Love on Jamestown Road in Inchicore. There was a fire there some time ago and residents are concerned for their health and the health of their children as there was asbestos in the building.

To ask the Area Manager what will be done to secure safety and access to pedestrian crossing at the junction of Cooley Road and Slievemore Road where cars park on double yellow line and obstruct access to pedestrian crossing. Wheelchairs, people with low mobility and elderly people need full access. Residents have asked for bollards.

To ask the Area Manager to review the situation of DCC car park at corner of Cromwellsfort Road and St Agnes Road, Crumlin Cross. There is a big underground car park across the street at the Ashleaf Shopping Centre, so keeping this small one seems redundant. This parking is not maintained and offers a chaotic system for drivers. After hours, cars cut through the parking lot to avoid waiting at the traffic light which represent a huge danger for pedestrians. Tree planting would offer a solution there to counteract air pollution from heavy traffic going through this intersection and air pollution from more cars at the Applegreen gas station on St Agnes Road. A green area there is needed to transform this intersection into a pleasant environment for non-car users.

To ask Area Manager if there is a plan to add more cycling lane on St Agnes Road. It is a very dangerous environment for cyclists. An effort has been made to add a cycling lane in Crumlin Village on St Agnes Road but there is no cycling lane north and south of this small section of cycling lane.
