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South City Markets Fire Relief Fund: Introduction

In the early morning hours of Saturday, 27 August 1892, a fire broke out in the South City Markets, off South Great George's Street, Dublin. The Markets occupied a neo-Gothic building constructed ten years previously with frontage to George's Street east and Fade Street on the South. A covered Market Arcade bisected the building and ran from George's Street to Drury Street. The building was rented to shopkeepers, many of whom lived over their shops; and space was rented to stallholders who transacted business in the Market Arcade.

The fire of Saturday 27 August was described at the time on the words of Lord Mayor Joseph M. Meade as "... the most disastrous ... that had ever taken place in the city". In fact, although there was extensive loss of goods and possessions, there was no loss of life and the building itself, though severely damaged, was salvaged and restored. The original façade is that which we see today.

It was the stallholders, however, who suffered most, having sustained a severe financial loss by the destruction of their stock. Owing to the transient nature of their business, it had not been possible for them to insure their merchandise. A spontaneous wave of public sympathy was evident, and in response to this, the Lord Mayor convened an "influential meeting" of Dublin's most prominent citizens, which was held in the Oak Room of the Mansion House at 4 p.m. on Monday 29 August 1892. The meeting resolved: "That a committee be formed to collect subscriptions for the relief of the small stallholders and residents in the South City Market, and for the purpose of relieving those who have been rendered destitute by the late calamitous fire, and that the committee shall have the power to distribute the fund according to their discretion ...". A committee was then elected under the chairmanship of the Lord Mayor, and a subscription list was opened.

The Committee met at the Mansion House eight times between 29 August and 29 September 1892. Its business was to publish subscription lists, consider applications for relief and to authorize payments from the Fund. In order to verify applications for relief, a sub-committee was formed on 29 August "to consider into the actual loss sustained by the small stallholders and residents and report to the Committee…" (Ch. 3 /1-8).

Subscriptions were received mainly from residents of Dublin city and county. Benefit concerts were organized by the Carl Rosa Opera Company at the Leinster Hall on 8 September and by Dan Lowry at the Star Theatre of Varieties on 10 September. When the subscription list was closed on 29 September, the total amount received came to £1972 $16 \, s. \, 4 \, d.$

Applications for relief were presented by stallholders; by employees of shopkeepers, now out of work; and by residents. Payment was refused in a number of cases where losses were already covered by insurance. When the final payments were authorized on 29 September, a total of £1142 6s. 7d. had been paid in grants and a further £53 4s. 7d. had been paid to cover administrative expenses. The balance in hand came to £776 5s. 3d.; and the Committee then adjourned to prepare its final report.

The report was duly printed (Ch. 3/4) and was circulated to all subscribers, who ere invited to attend a Final Meeting on 27 October, to consider the report and to decide upon the dispersal of funds. The meeting endorsed the Committee's report and decided that subscribers should be reimbursed with a portion of subscription *pro rata*. An idea which was extensively discussed at the Final Meeting, concerned the donation of the surplus to the Fire Brigade in appreciation of their services in fighting the blaze. Although at the time it was felt that this would be going beyond the defined powers of the Committee, the idea gave rise to a separate Fire Brigade Fund which was set up in December 1892. many of those who subscribed to this Fund did so out of the contributions returned from the surplus of the South City Markets Fund.

The Records

The records of the South City Markets Fire Relief Fund were discovered in panelled wainscoting in the Mansion House, Dublin in July 1980 along with the records of other charitable committees: Ch /1 Dublin Mansion House Committee for the Relief of Distress in Ireland, 1980; Ch /2 Canadian Fund for the Relief of Distress in Ireland, 1880; Ch /4 Achill Improvement Fund, 1894; and Barry Sullivan Memorial Fund Ch /5. All these collections were transferred to the Archives Division at City Hall, Dame Street, Dublin 2, where preliminary sorting and listing were carried out. A fully descriptive list is now available for the records of the Mansion House Committee (Ch /1)

The records of the South City Markets Fire Relief Fund may be looked at in conjunction with the records of other charitable committees to provide an insight into the response of 19th century society to disaster. Even at the time, the efficiency with which the South City Markets Fund was organized was favourably commented upon. Nevertheless, the letters received from the victims of the blaze – perhaps the most interesting group in the collection – demonstrate the actual want and suffering experienced by these people. These letters also throw light on the day-to-day organization of the Markets prior to the blaze, containing as they do, itemized accounts of the business life of the area.

In this collection, descriptive entries and the arrangement of documents within groups were prepared as part of work experience by students taking the Diplomas in Archival Studies, U.C.D. session 1981-82. Marie Altzinger described and arranged documents in group III, relating to the administration of the fund and in group IV, section i-ii comprising letters received by the Committee from subscribers. Rose Doyle described and arranged documents in group IV, sectiond iii-v, consisting of letters received from stallholders and proprietors, from employees and from residents. Norma Foley described and arranged documents in groups VII and VIII relating to the einding-up of the Fund and to the Fire Brigade Fund. Their invaluable assistance in the preparation of this descriptive list is gratefully acknowledged.

II: Treasurers (Ch 3/5 – Ch 3 /16)

The financial affairs of the Fund were watched by four treasurers: the Lord Mayor (Joseph M. Meade); Lord Mayor-Elect (James Shanks); Sir Robert Sexton and William Findlater. Subscriptions were lodged to the Fund's credit at the Hibernian Bank (Ch 3 /6). Payment of grants to whose affected by the fire was generally by cheque (se ledger Ch 3 /14 – no cheque stubs have survived). Apart from payment of grants, overheads were light, consisting mainly of expenses for advertising and printing (Ch 3 /12). As appears from the ledger, secretarial service amounted to a mere 10 guineas (Ch 3 /14); and the auditing of the accounts was carried out free of charge).

III: Administration of Fund (Ch 3 /17-41)

The administration of the Fund was carried out by the Assistant Secretary, Mr A. Keogh. His main responsibilities were as follows: maintaining the subscription lists (Ch 3/17-23); and lists of those in receipt of grants (Ch 3/35-41).

Although most of the claims submitted to the Fund were informally presented under covering letters (see Section IV), a number of itemized statements of losses sustained were also received. These statements (Ch 3 /24-34) give an indication of the equipment, fittings and stock in each stall. Some of the claims were inadmissible (see Ch 3 /24-26), since the applicants were in a position to be covered by insurance.

It is interesting to note that the letters are incoming only; if indeed Committee maintained damp-press letter-books recording out-going letters, these have not survived. The incoming letters fall into various categories. Those received from subscribers are very numerous, some 171 in all (see Ch 3/43-213). These letters are, in the main, no more than covering notes for enclosed subscriptions. Some subscribers had, however, suggestions to offer as to the collection and dispersal of money (see Ch 3/197-213). Perhaps the most curious proposal was that telegrammed by the anonymous "Sympathy" who suggested that money could be raised by giving tours of the burnt-out stalls, charging one shilling per head (see Ch 3/210).

The letters received from and on behalf of stallholders and proprietors affected by fire, contain much detailed information regarding the contents of stalls before tha blaze and the attempts of those affected to re-establish their business (see Ch 3/214-236). Many employees of businesses destroyed in the fire were made unemployed and they, too, applied to the committee for grants to tide them over (Ch 3/237-253).

As the printed report states, the Sub-Committee "... investigated each case, and reported in detail to the Committee their individual merits". Many of these cases were difficult to asssess, either from the extravagance of the claims preferred, or from the difficulty of verifying them. Feats of heroism were described, mainly the rescue of some ladies from Warren's Hotel (Ch 3 /256) and the rescue of Widow White (Ch 3 /263 – 264).

FIRE BRIGADE FUND (Ch 3/323 – 336)

An early suggestion for disposal of surplus funds was presented by William Field at the Committee's final meeting on 29 September. Field suggested the provision of a grant to the men of the Fire Brigade who had fought the blaze for nearly 24 hours. On that occasion, it was noted that to dispose of surplus funds in this manner would be going beyond the powers originally voted to the Committee, and as we have already seen, there were returned to the subscribers on a PRO RATA basis.

The idea lingered, however, and in December 1892, a separate Fire Brigade Fund was opened, with Field and A. Keogh Nolan as Hon. Secretaries. As noted in their circular letter (Ch 3/292) "... had not the Brigade... succeeded in preserving the whiskey stored under the Market from the fire, a disaster probably affecting a large district of the city, could not have been averted".

Many of those who subscribed to the new fund did so out of contributions returned from the earlier disaster fund.
