STATUTORY DECLARATION

(01) 222 2261. This Department has no objection to the positioning of a Hoist/Cherry Picker/Vehicle/Equipment as detailed above, subject to compliance with the following conditions:

- A comprehensive Health & Safety Statement, prepared by competent person, is in place.
- Local Garda notified Banksman/pointsman on duty
- Provision is made for the safe passage of vehicular/pedestrian traffic around the hoist/cherry picker/vehicle/equipment
- The Permit is retained on site for inspection by authorised officers of Dublin City Council
- Identification signs and reflective markings (if required) are displayed
- Prepayment for any metered, pay & display or disc parking bays that will be affected by the positioning of the hoist/cherry picker/vehicle/equipment is received by this office
- If the hoist/cherry picker/vehicle/equipment is being located on a pedestrian zone during operational hours, arrangements for its movement to and from site must be approved by An Garda Síochána.
- Traffic management arrangements are to comply with Traffic Signs Manual Chapter 8 "Temporary Traffic Measures and Signs for Roadworks" published by the Department of Transport.
- Comply with Planning & other legislation.
- Letter drop required to inform local stakeholders.
- Other conditions as specified below
