Happiness with Quality of Life

74% of respondents were quite happy or very happy with their quality of life – up from 71% in 2014



- Happiness increases among older age groups, and increases in line with monthly income
- Reported happiness is higher among those living in Dublin 5 years or more
- Happiness is positively correlated with perceived air quality, water quality and noise levels
- Happiness is higher among those who see "people / friendliness" as being the best thing about the area where they live

Community Involvement

48% felt part of their local community, similar to the 49% recorded in 2014



- Feeling part of the community increases with age and is highest among the retired (71%)
- Members of a sports, social or community group were twice as likely to feel part of their community



Community Involvement (contd.)

- 30% felt that they can have an input into local decision making that affects them. This rises to 41% among over 50s.
- 29% felt that they played an active role in their local community. This increases with age, and is higher among males (34%) than among females (24%).
- Online engagement was the most popular way for 18-34 year olds to get more involved with their local community, while information leaflets were more popular among over 65s
- 15% felt that their opinion is well represented in terms of how they want to see Dublin, as a capital city, improve. This is up from 11% in 2014



 Feeling part of the local community and playing an active role in the local community are positively correlated with overall happiness with quality of life



Civic Engagement

- In the past 2 years, 73% of respondents had been actively involved in some kind of community based group activity
- This was highest among over 65s (79%)
- Word of mouth is the most common medium for finding out about group activities
- The majority of respondents would consider their local council as a better source of information than their local councillor for social housing, upkeep of the local area, upkeep of roads, and planning / development

Social Enterprise

• 20% of respondents were aware of social enterprises in the area where they lived. Awareness is highest among those living in Dublin city area codes 1 to 24.

Local Election Voting Rights

 79% of respondents were aware that residents of Ireland can vote in local elections, similar to the 80% recorded in 2014



- Awareness is highest among those living in Dublin more than 5 years
- Awareness is significantly lower among non-Irish residents, at 69%



Environment

- 64% rated water quality in their area as good or excellent
- 54% rated air quality in their area as good or excellent
- 49% rated noise levels in their area as good or excellent
- 18% rated traffic levels in their area as good or excellent
- Male respondents rated water quality higher than female respondents
- Air quality was rated good or excellent by 47% of Dublin City Council area residents, lower than other local authorities

Accessibility

 Improved footpaths and wheelchair access were among suggestions for improving accessibility in local areas

 Proximity to the city centre, amenities and nature were commonly cited as being respondents' favourite thing about where they live



Tourist bed-night tax

- 46% would support a tourist bed-night tax, up from 39% in 2014
- Support was highest in the Dublin City Council area at 53%








- Online survey, 20th March 31st March 2019










Employment Status





Monthly Disposable Income After Bills Are Paid






Taking all things into consideration, overall how happy are you with your life right now?




Taking all things into consideration, overall how happy are you with your life right now?

Reported happiness increased with monthly income










I feel part of my local community agreeing or strongly agreeing, by group membership




- 85% of those who feel part of their local community are quite or very happy with their life.
- 54% of those who do not feel part of their local community are quite or very happy with their life
- 86% of those who feel they can have an input into local decision making are quite or very happy with their life
- 60% of those who do not feel they can have an input into local decision making are quite or very happy with their life
- 83% of those who play an active role in their community are quite or very happy with their life
- 68% of those who do not play an active role in their community are quite or very happy with their life

- I could do so much more to be involved and take part in community events.

 such as food sharing potlucks (like street feast) or meetings
- Dublin has to much of a car culture. The only possibility to bump into each other is with your direct neighbour. There should be more focus on pedestrians, public transport and community areas / activity



In the last two years have you been actively involved in any of the following types of groups or activities?




- 73% of respondents involved in some kind of group activity


How did you initially find out about getting involved in:











Are you personally involved with any Social Enterprise(s) in the area where you live?







Aware of Residents' Right to Vote in Local Elections by local authority






Aware of Residents' Right to Vote in Local Elections by time living in Dublin

Awareness of Residents' Right to Vote in Local Elections by nationality







Rating Water Quality Good or Excellent by local authority





Rating Air Quality Good or Excellent by monthly disposable income










Rating Traffic Levels Good or Excellent by local authority



Can you suggest any accessibility initiatives that would benefit your area? Typical Comments

- The footpaths and roads are in a bad state, I can imagine it is difficult for anyone with a physical disability to get around
- Survey of footpaths to ensure dips are present, paths are wide enough & commercial obstructions such as shop signs are removed.
- There are some pavements that are in a bad state of repair in my area, repairing these is a simple way to make life easier for everyone. Also, there are a lot of cars that park on the pavement not leaving enough space for wheelchairs, buggies etc to get around. There are also some local shops that don't have disability reserved parking outside.
- As in most parts of Dublin, people deliberately and selfishly park their vehicles on pedestrian walkways and cycle lanes preventing access to wheelchair and mobility vehicle users.
- Access to local park could be improved. Wheelchair access is only feasible to an individual (not being pushed) through one access point of 3 (not signposted),






Tourist Bed-Night Tax
