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Goals and Priorities

- Among the general public, the two most important goals for Dublin City Council were “To build safe, thriving neighbourhoods” and “To work towards achieving a green, low carbon city”
- Among PPN respondents, the two most important goals for Dublin City Council were “To build safe, thriving neighbourhoods” and “To support and engage active, inclusive communities”

Any Goals Missing

- The most common theme that general public respondents felt was missing from the draft goals was the provision of affordable / social housing, and affordable rent
- Among PPN respondents the most common theme respondents felt was missing from the draft goals was the promotion of equality / tolerance / inclusivity / diversity

Playing a Role in Achieving These Goals

- Among the general public
 - 81% felt that they were currently playing a role in the goal **“To work towards achieving a green, low carbon city”**
 - The most common example given was through **cycling or walking**
 - 58% felt that they were currently playing a role in the goal **“To support and engage active, inclusive communities”**
 - The most common example given was through **involvement in community groups**
 - 56% felt that they were currently playing a role in the goal **“To sustain a vibrant cultural life”**
 - The most common example given was through **attending events / theatre / exhibitions etc.**
 - 55% felt that they were currently playing a role in the goal **“To build safe, thriving neighbourhoods”**
 - The most common example given was through **involvement in community groups**
 - 47% felt that they were currently playing a role in the goal **“To continue to grow a strong, diverse economy”**
 - The most common example given was through **work / by being employed or an employer**
 - 34% felt that they were currently playing a role in the goal **“To promote compact growth with connected infrastructure”**
 - The most common example given was through **using public transport**

Playing a Role in Achieving These Goals

- Among PPN respondents
 - 96% felt that they were currently playing a role in the goal **“To support and engage active, inclusive communities”**
 - 88% felt that they were currently playing a role in the goal **“To build safe, thriving neighbourhoods”**
 - 72% felt that they were currently playing a role in the goal **“To sustain a vibrant cultural life”**
 - 59% felt that they were currently playing a role in the goal **“To work towards achieving a green, low carbon city”**
 - 53% felt that they were currently playing a role in the goal **“To continue to grow a strong, diverse economy”**
 - 32% felt that they were currently playing a role in the goal **“To promote compact growth with connected infrastructure”**

Examples of how PPN respondents play these roles were specific to each group / organisation.

Principles

- Among the general public, the top three principles that people felt should guide Dublin City Council in their work were:
 - Sustainability
 - Accountability
 - Commitment to public service
- “Accountability” and “Commitment to public service” were more popular among older respondents
- “Sustainability” was more popular among younger respondents
- Among PPN respondents, the top three principles that respondents felt should guide Dublin City Council in their work were:
 - Sustainability
 - Commitment to public service
 - Accountability

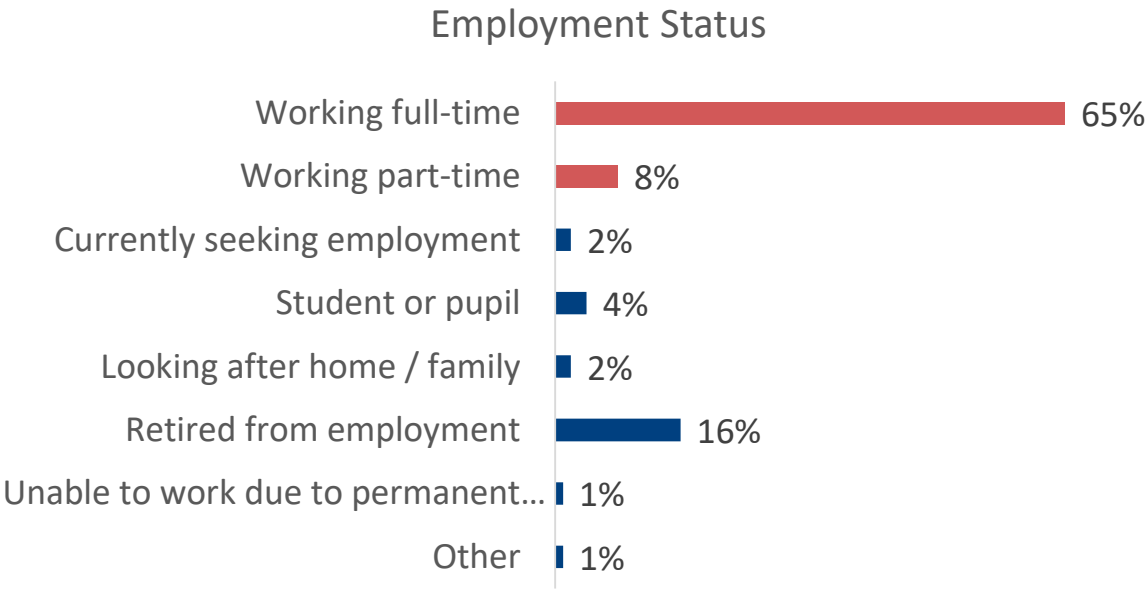
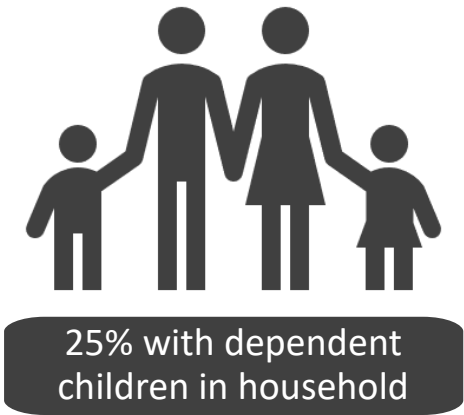
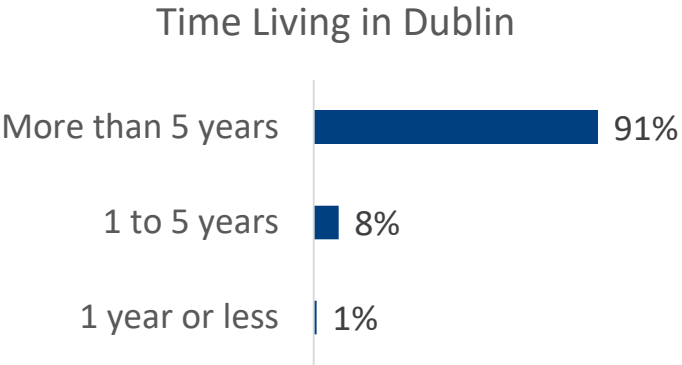
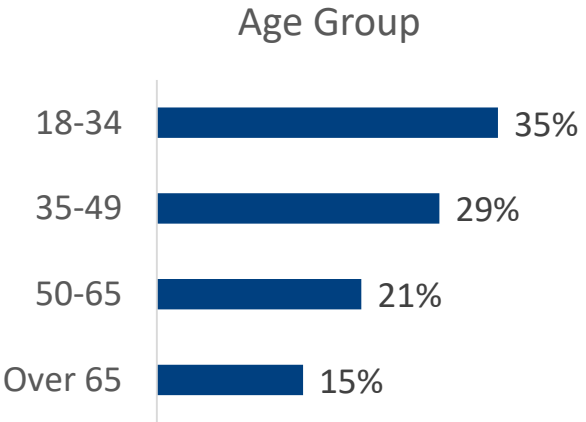
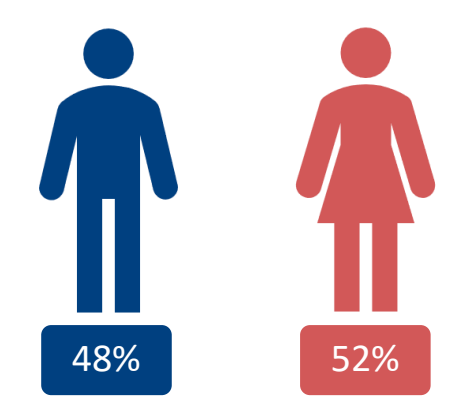
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- Online survey, 9th October – 23rd October 2019
- 802 respondents, from “Your Dublin, Your Voice” opinion panel
- 76 respondents from organisations in the Public Participation Network (PPN)
- 22% response rate
- Global margin of error = +/- 3.5%
- Robust panel in existence since 2010, recruitment through various channels



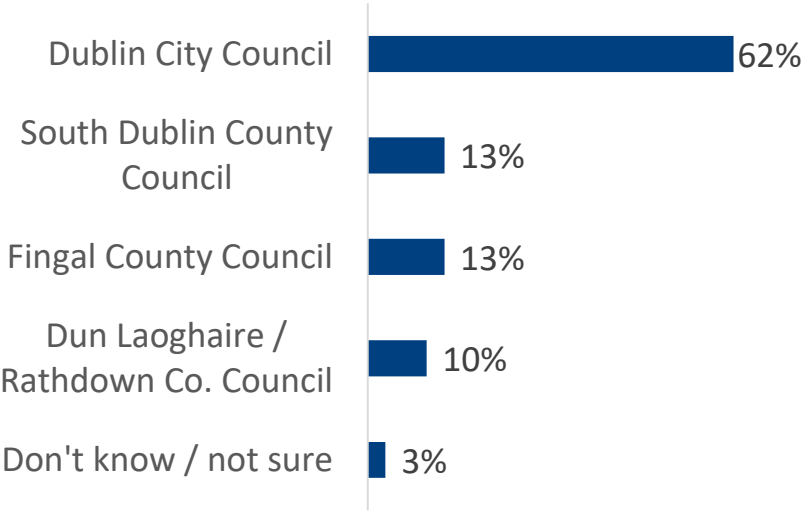
Respondent Profile

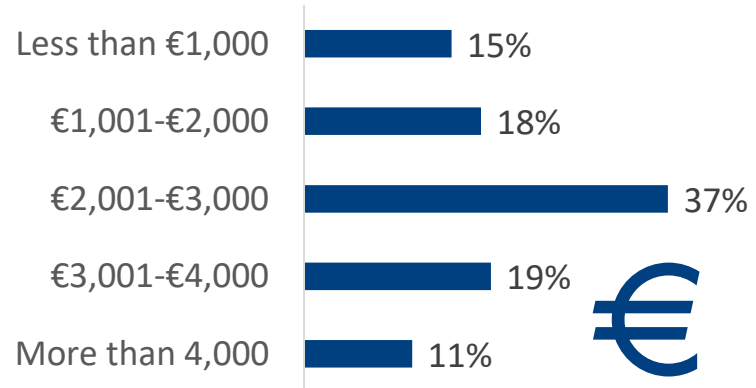

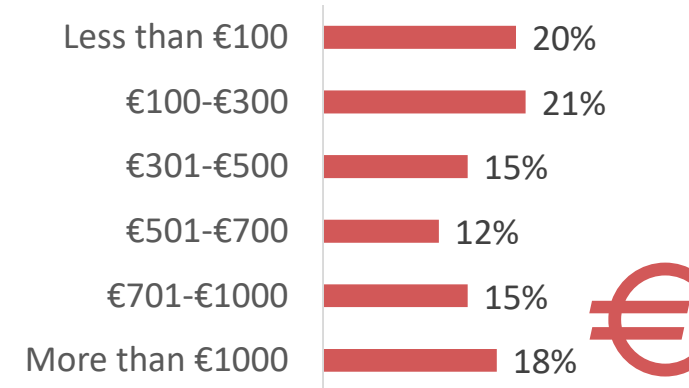

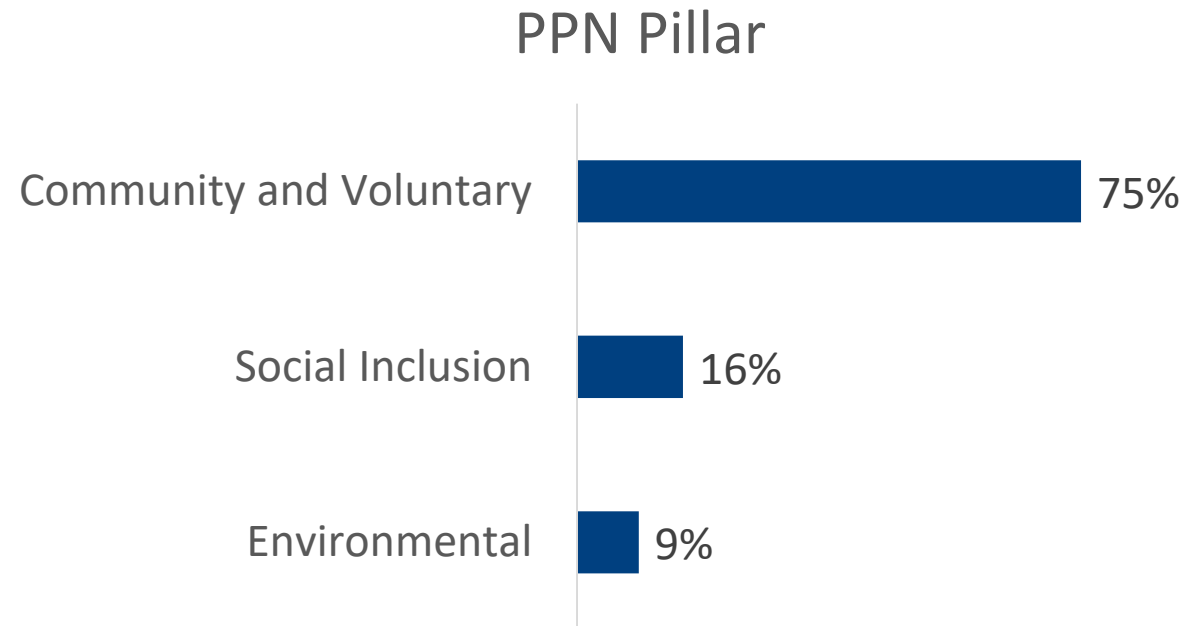

Monthly Disposable Income After Bills Are Paid





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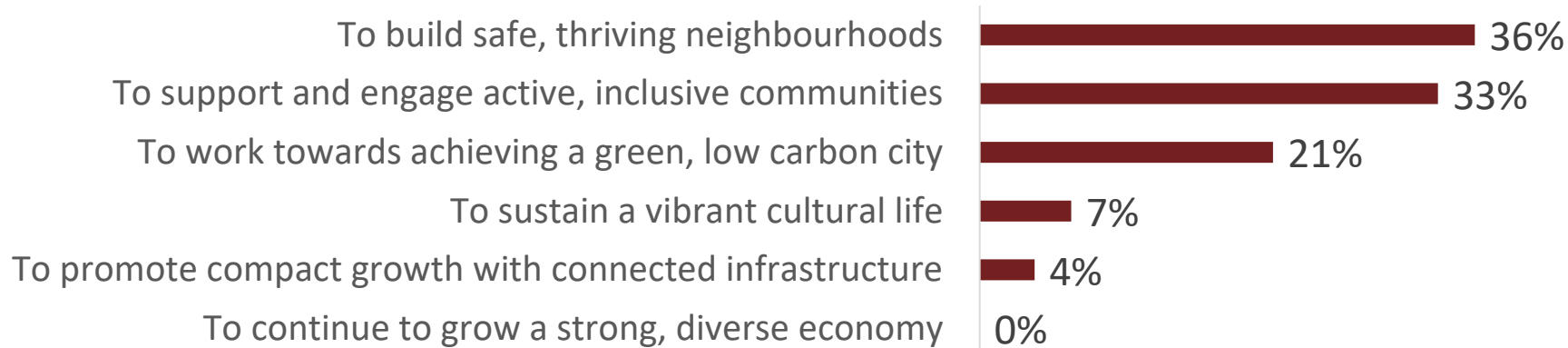

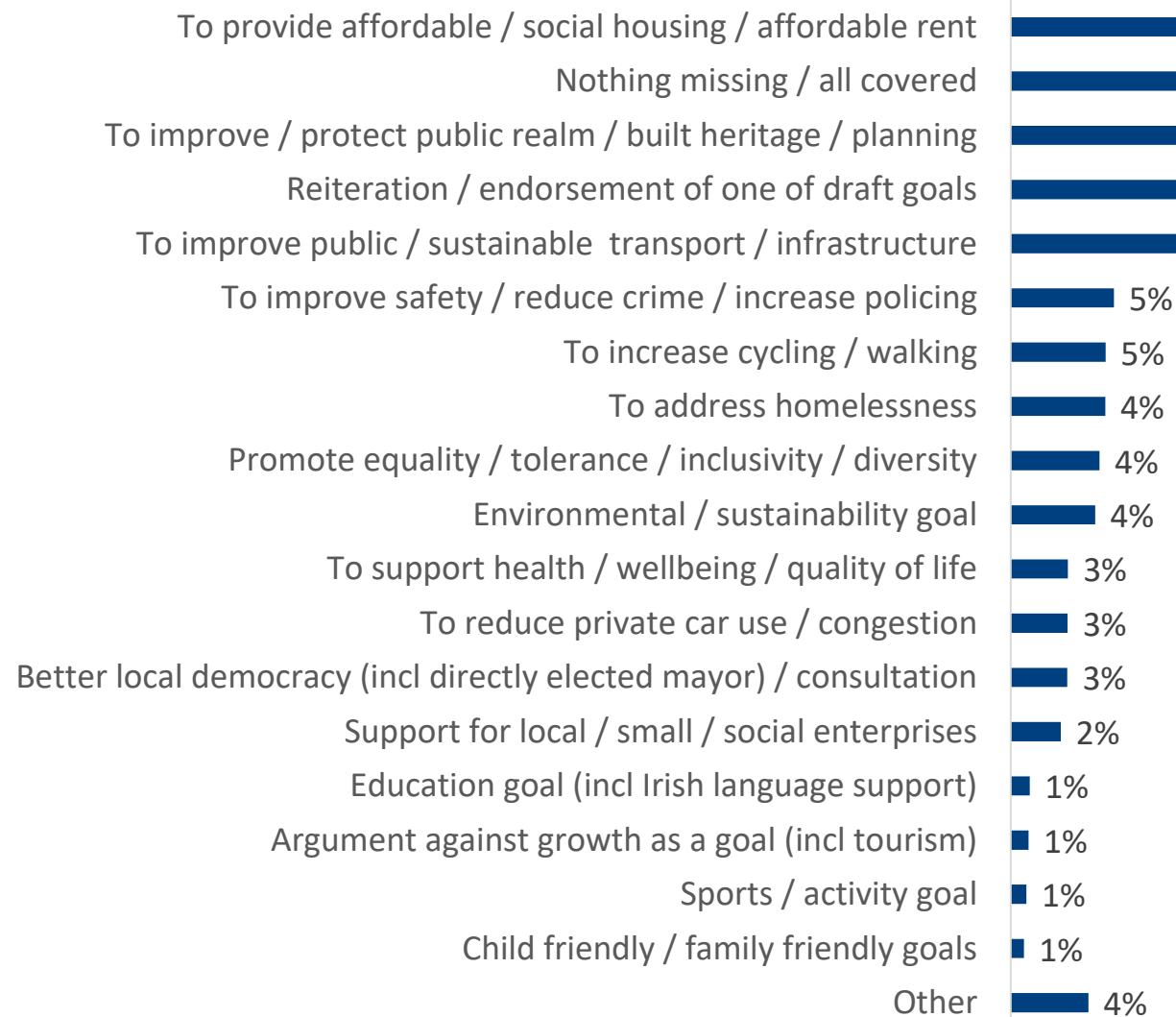


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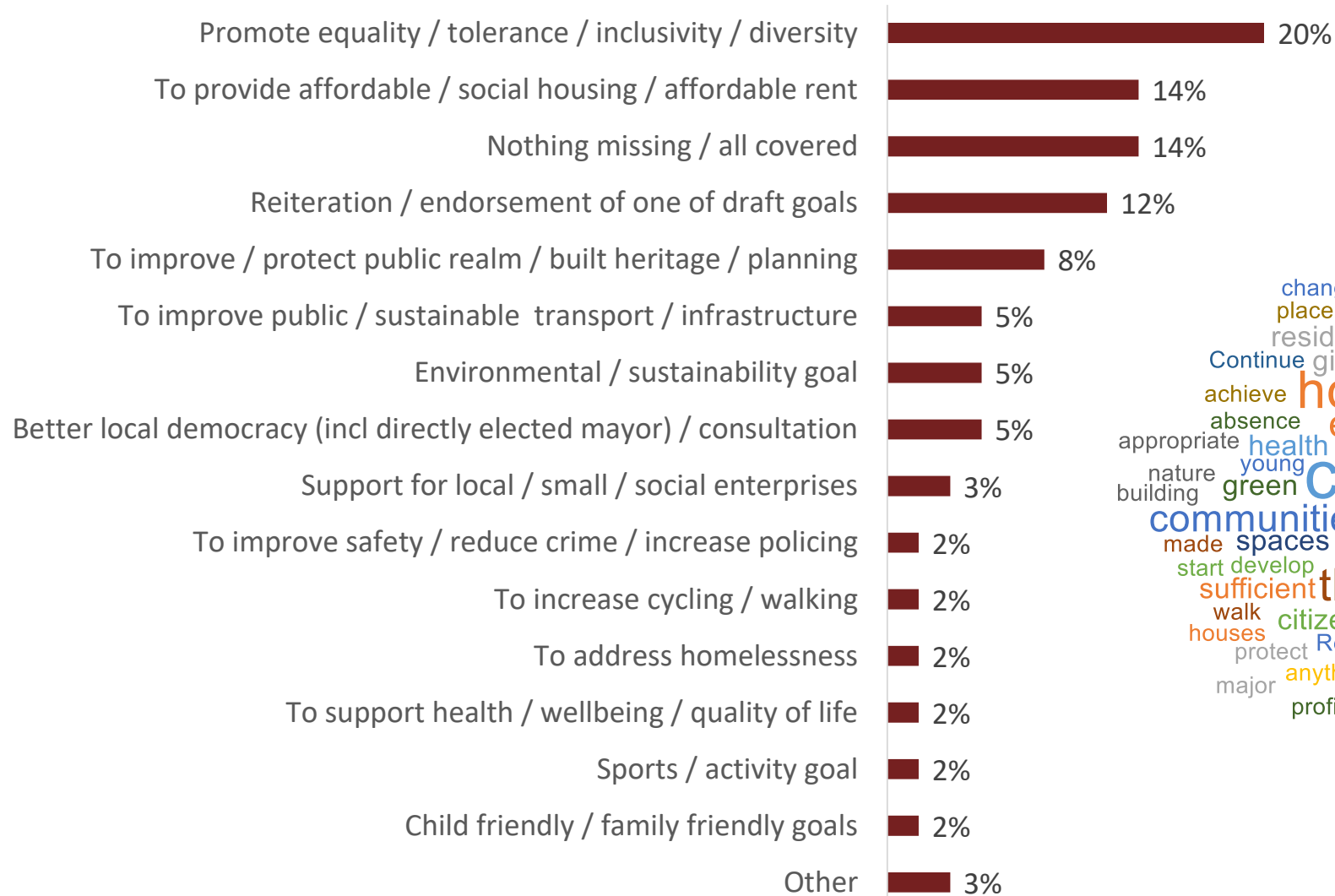

What, if anything, is missing that you feel is important for Dublin City?

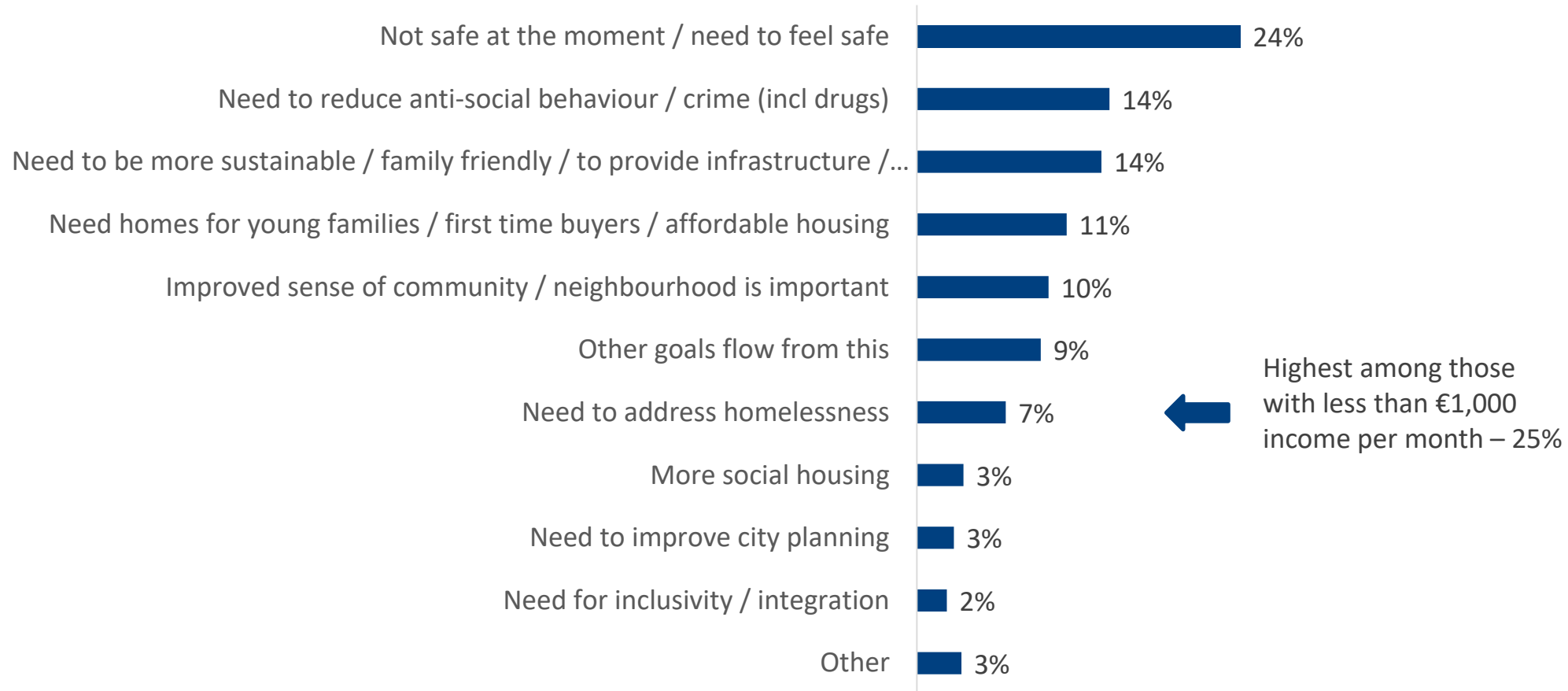

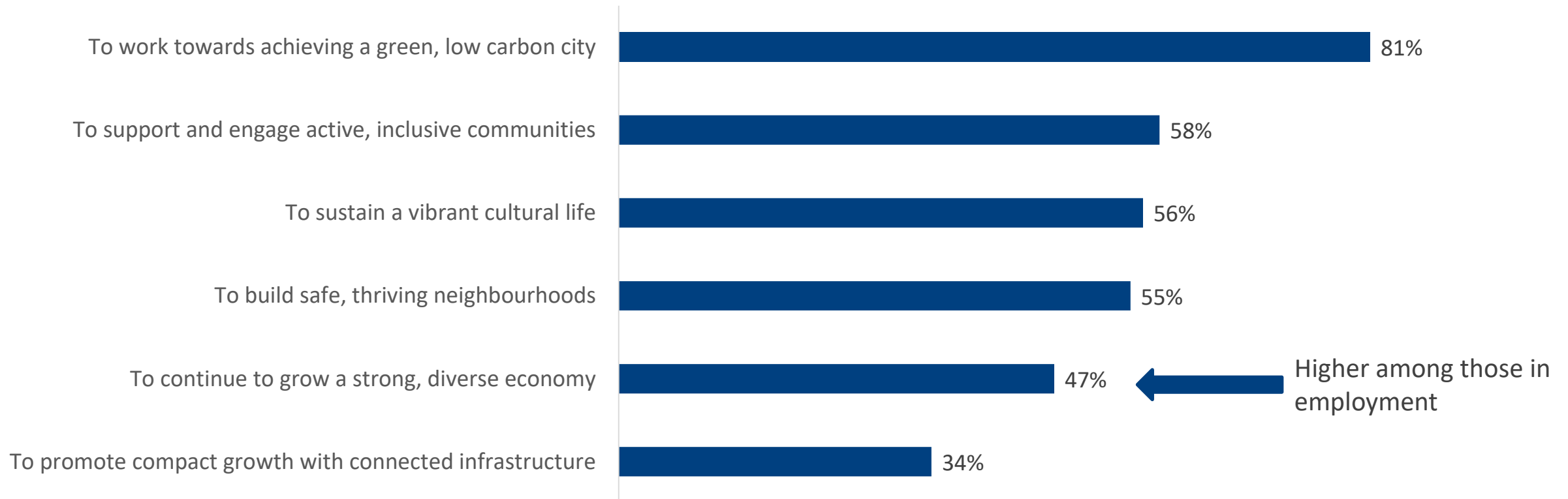

Do you feel that you are already playing a role in either your personal or work life in the achievement of these draft goals?

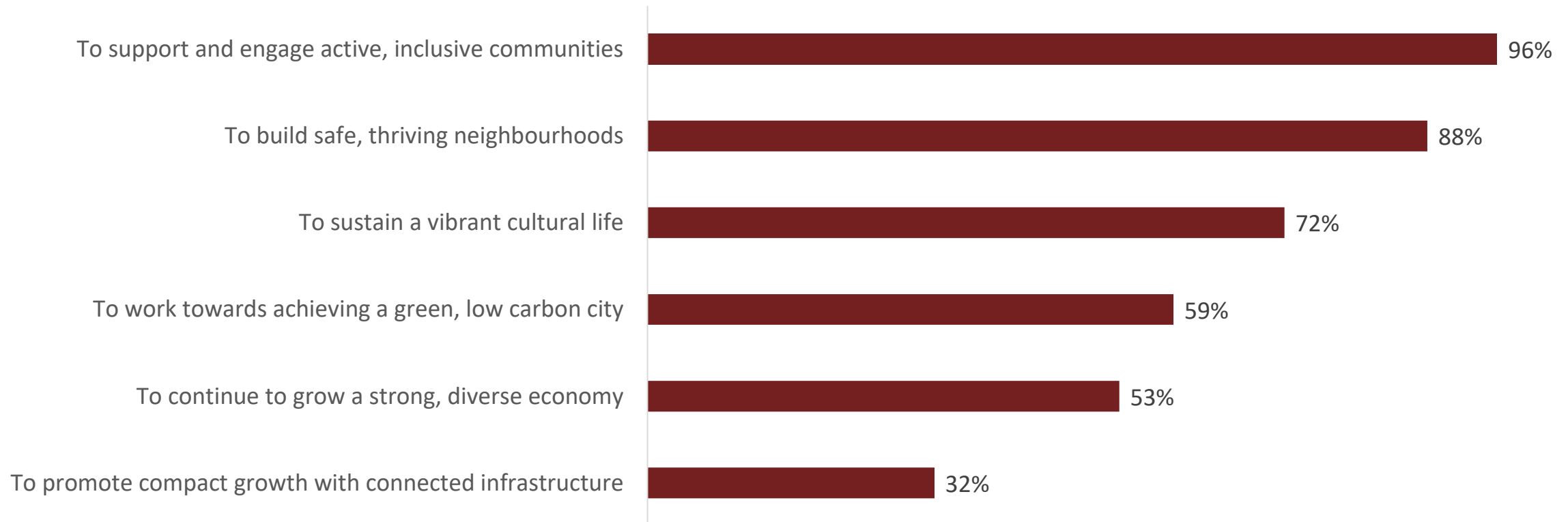

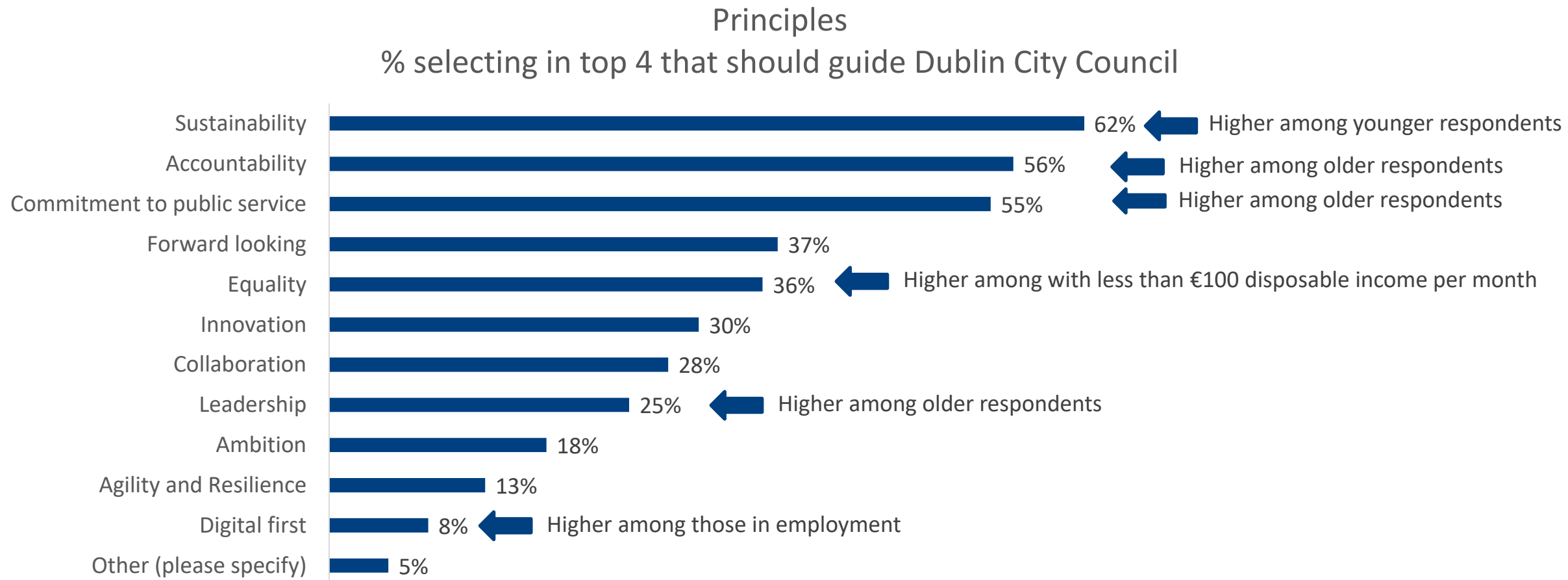
Do you feel that your group or organisation is already playing a role in the achievement of these draft goals?

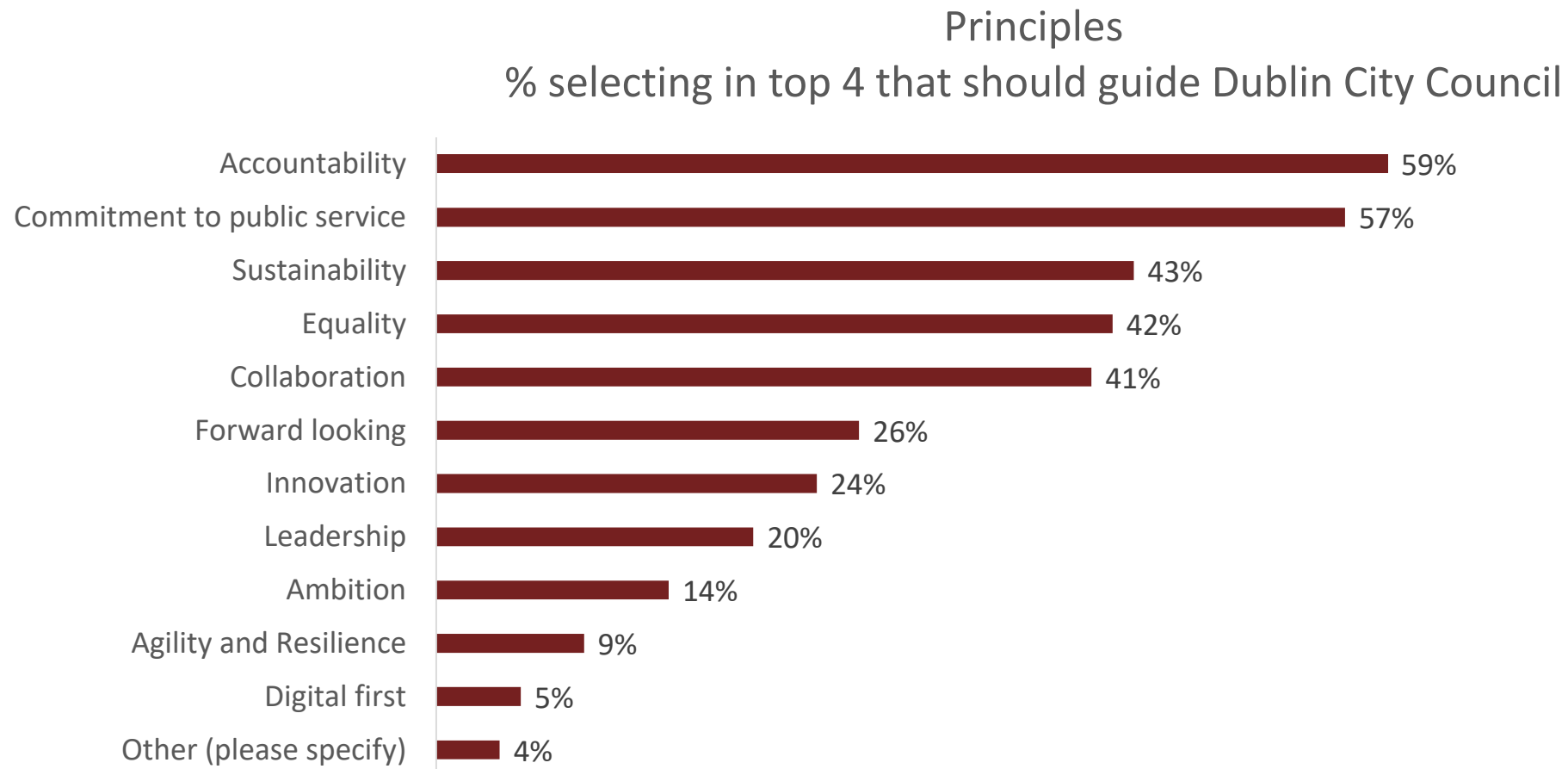


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“Principles are key to the way we in Dublin City Council work to achieve our goals. Which of the following principles do you think should guide us as an organisation in our work? Please choose up to four:”
