1.	Covid-19 Testing	 HSE are providing testing service on sites- TAU will support these groups going forward. A discussion was had regarding testing for Covid-19 on sites. The rationale behind this should be provision for safety reasons and not targeting the Traveller community.
		 should be provision for safety reasons and not targeting the Traveller community. To date there has been 89 cases within the Travelling community, 19 of which have been within Dublin. TravAct are working voluntarily to support the testing of Travellers in the Coolock area. It was agreed further engagement is needed between the Residents and Traveller organizations. This is to ensure that there is understanding as to why Travellers are considered a high risk group and need to be tested in the interest of their own safety. It was agreed further engagement is needed with Primary Health Care Workers regarding testing within the Traveller community.

2.	Updates	 TAU continuing to Allocate Traveller Accommodation throughout the Ballymun area. Community projects: Cara Park /St. Margaret's Park. St Trinity School are involved in integrating the community together through projects run in these areas. Notices to Remove: TAU will continue to engage with the residents to negotiate alternatives, explain duties and responsibilities on both sides, when issuing notices to remove. TAU are responding to a number of illegal occupants in St. Josephs Park. Three to four weeks behind on the redesign of St Dominic and Tara Lawns.
3.	Waste Management	 A discussion was had regarding the illegal dumping in Labre Park. BTAP stated that residents in Labre went 24hrs without electricity due to refuse stacked against electricity boxes being lit on fire. A need for a multi-agency approach to tackle this issue is needed. It was agreed that a waste meeting would take place @11am before the next LTACC meeting. TAU are continuing to work with other departments within the organization to seek possible solutions.
3.	Subcommittee groups	 It was agreed nomination are needed for housing and waste subcommittee groups. Nominations – It was agreed nominations for subcommittee groups would be emailed to : traveller.accomodation@dublincity.ie It was agreed the breakdown of the finances that has been spent on waste removal be sent to members for discussion at the next waste meeting.
4.	Labre Park	 Part 8 planning update: TAU are awaiting a final report in relation to flood risk management. This report is expected before the end of October. It was agreed more communication would be provided to all stakeholders involved by the end of October regarding the status of part 8 planning permission.
5.	Budgets	 How budgets are Allocated has been changed- the department will now allocate funding following expenditure as supposed to in advance as had been previously been the case. Although the TAU budget has increased, Covid-19 along with flood risk assessments has delayed projects.
6.	LTACC Meetings	It was agreed LTACC meetings will be held at @11.30am via MS Teams on 23rd October.
