IURC is the second phase of the International Urban Cooperation Program and we are delighted that Dublin City Council has been accepted onto the program and will work in cooperation with Seoul in South Korea.

The cooperation will be focused on three thematic networks which are Ecological Transition & Green Deal, Urban & Regional Renewal & Social Cohesion and Innovative Sustainable & Carbon Neutral Ecosystems and Strategic Sectors.

Thursday 30th September saw the hosting of the kick-off meeting, which was opened by Patrick Polacsek from the EU Delegation to Korea, and featured presentations from city partners Busan, Sejong, Rotterdam, Sofia, Seoul. Our own Dublin City presentation was given by our Climate Action Officer, Dr. Sabrina Dekker. Covered were topics like business and circular economy, the Climate Action plan and projects like District Heating and active mobility.

The partnership will involve virtual meetings and exchange visits and offers a great opportunity for skill sharing and learning from innovations in other cities.

MAKE WAY DAY



Make Way Day is a national awareness campaign, which took place on September 24th, and aims to educate and inform the public of the obstacles which have been inadvertently placed in the way of people with disabilities. These obstacles create significant difficulties for people with disabilities when attempting to negotiate their way through towns and cities. The Active Travel Communication & Promotion Team organised a lunchtime webinar on Tuesday, September 21st 'Make Way Everyday - overcoming everyday obstacles to accessible streets' to hear from about the impact blocked streets have on people with disabilities and learn more about the Make Way Day campaign. The webinar, which was facilitated by Michael Foley of One Open Dialogue, included Panelists:

In addition, Make Way Day posters were placed in a range of DCC buildings and a social media campaign was run to raise awareness of the everyday challenges faced by people with disabilities. A video showcasing some of the key issues was produced and was published on all our social media channels. We also encouraged people to complete the Disability Federation of Ireland survey, detailing any obstacles on the footpaths in their local area. Feedback from the survey will be used to inform officials of key areas in need of intervention.
