

**Director of Services Report
South Central Area Committee Meeting
20th July 2022**

SOUTH WEST INNER CITY ELECTORAL AREA

Public Realm & Capital Programmes

Francis Street Environmental Improvement Scheme: works continue, with additional resources now being made available by the contractor and a second work site just commenced opposite the Iveagh Market. The project will continue until the end of the year.

Dolphin's Barn Interim Environmental Improvements: the Area Office proposes to conduct a short non-statutory advertisement of planned streetscape improvements along Dolphin's Barn Street by the end of July to assess local support for the measures. The measures include the addition of planters, seats, cycle parking frames, protection of pedestrian only areas, and a large planted area with trees at the Coombe. The measures will be advertised on boards at the four locations along Dolphin's Barn Street.

Donore Avenue landscaping: it is hoped to go to site with this small greening measure shortly (awaiting our contractor). The measure will provide a raised planted area with shrubs and ground cover planting and a seat to the back of the footpath.

Bridgefoot Street Park: a local liaison group is being set-up to address issues that may arise at the new park as it establishes, including project snagging issues, maintaining a safe park, and community use and activities.

Protecting Heritage: the Area Office is working with the City Heritage and Conservation Offices to commissioned contractors to control and treat invasive plant growth on the historic city walls (Cook Street and Cornmarket) and to refurbish parapets on three Liffey Bridges (O'Donovan Rossa to Mellows). Both project to complete by September. The Area Office also actively supports property owners to maintain and improve the built heritage of the area through the Shopfront Improvement Scheme and other grant programmes.

Economic Development

The **Shopfront Improvement Scheme 2022** expects to support over 25 projects this year, delivering an overall investment of €145k across the SWIC area. There are notable delays completing projects this year.

Tyrone Place Dublin 8. Regeneration.

A review of the development options for the regeneration of Tyrone Place is currently being undertaken by Housing Management, the Local Area Office and City Architects. All are cognisant that redevelopment options will need to take into consideration the large social and cost rental housing scheme that is planned for the adjacent site at Emmet Road.

School Street.

DCC received Stage 1 approval from the DHLGH for the regeneration of School Street and Thomas Court Bawn with a number of queries. These queries have now been replied to and submitted to the D.H.L.G.H. Upon approval, the commencement of the procurement of an integrated design team for the redevelopment project will begin.

Oliver Bond Regeneration.

DCC have received Stage 1 project approval from the DHLGH for the first phase of the regeneration of Oliver Bond, which is for the redevelopment of Blocks L, M and N. We also received funding for a Community Development Worker to be appointed to the Oliver Bond regeneration project.

DCC City Architects and Housing Regeneration staff are currently reviewing queries received as part of our Stage 1 project approval to seek project budget approval.

Dolphin House Regeneration Masterplan Dublin 8.

The Dolphin House Regeneration Masterplan approved on the 4th Feb 2021 by the DH Regeneration Board. DCC will progress the masterplan in conjunction with the Dolphin House Regeneration Board and the Dolphin House Community.

Dolphin 1B.

Stage 1 project and funding approval has been received for the construction of approximately 25 new homes.

Design development is progressing and community consultation on the proposals are proposed to take place shortly.

It is anticipated to start the Part 8 process in early Q4 2022

Donore Avenue-(former Saint Teresa's Gardens)

This project will provide for the delivery of approximately 543 homes in a collaboration between Dublin City Council and the Land Development Agency, under a working title 'Donore Project'

28% of the homes provided will be for social housing and 72% for cost rental housing.

The breakdown of the social homes include:

41% 1 bed which 50% will be available for Older Person Accommodation

48% 2bed

11% 3 Bed

There is ongoing public consultation with local elected representatives, S.T.G. Regeneration Board and neighbours

A Part 10 planning application is due for lodgement late Q3 2022

Public Domain

25 City Neighbourhood Applications received. South Central Area Judging is in progress with finalists going on to the city-wide competition. The South Central Awards Ceremony will be held on 6th September 2022 at Richmond Barracks. Public Domain Intensive cleaning completed on Bulfin Road and Luby Road. St Anthony's Road, Crescent, Park, Rueben Street, & Reuben Walk will be cleaned on 18th & 19th July. Weed treatment Programme has concluded with many areas in the City, Inchicore, Maryland and Rialto receiving treatment. Graffiti has been removed from Cornmarket, Thomas Street, James Street, John Dillon Street, Lambe Alley, Back Lane, Swifts Alley, Marks Alley, Emmet Road, Hanover Lane and Arch, The Tinters, Thomas Court, Engine alley, Patrick Street, Bridgefoot Street, and Donore Avenue. 46 Waste Bye Law Compliance letters have been sent to Emmet Crescent in response to high levels of illegal dumping in the area. Mallin Avenue will follow shortly. 19 Community Clean-ups resourced in SWIC in June. Inchicore Parish Centre Bottle Bank has been chosen for animation and will be jointly funded by Waste Management and Public Domain. The art work is progressing at the moment. A Dublin Canvas Traffic Signal box in Inchicore Village has completed-Willie Bermingham portrait on Emmet Road. As new art boxes come on stream they are posted on social media. The Inchicore Dog show is on Thursday 14th July. St Michaels Estate and environs has been cleaned in advance of this free public domain supported event.

Kilmainham Mill

DCC intend entering into a contract shortly and works will commence on site in in the coming weeks in relation to stabilisation works at Kilmainham Mill. The works include the repair and replacement of roofs, the propping of collapsed floors, removal of all asbestos, protection of mill machinery, the sealing of window with mesh and the repair of rainwater goods. Some newer concrete structures will also be removed.

The works will take approximately 6 months to complete. DCC will maintain contact with local stakeholders throughout the process of these essential works, which will provide DCC with full and safe access to the Mill complex for the first time.

Chapelized Festival Committee put on a great programme of events too, highlights included the opening day party on the plaza. The Chapelized Festival is organised by volunteers and is a great credit to their hard work.

Drimnagh Festival took place over two days in early June and the local voluntary committee organised two hugely successful events in Brickfield Park and Good Counsel GAA club.

Public Domain

13 City Neighbourhood Applications have been received. Judging is in progress and all Finalists will proceed to the city-wide competition. Public Domain arranged a traffic management plan, weed removal and an intensive clean, of Raheen Park, Le Fanu Road and Bridge prior to the unveiling of a City Council Commemorative Plaque ceremony on Friday 8th July marking The Ballyfermot Train Ambush of 8th July 1921. The Weed treatment programme has concluded with a number of locations in Ballyfermot, Bluebell, Walkinstown and Chapelizod receiving treatment. Graffiti has been removed from Kylemore Road, Croftwood Park/Cherry Orchard Drive, Walkinstown and Bluebell. Waste Bye Law Compliance letters will be sent to Huband Road maisonettes over the coming weeks. Public Domain and Litter Enforcement are working together or addressing littering and illegal dumping in a number of locations in SCA. Illegal dumping at green space adjacent to La Touche Road shopping area is one location under investigation. 64 Community Clean ups resourced in June. A fabulous new art work "Tristan" to complement 2021 "Iseult" on Chapelizod Road Traffic Signal box has been completed see social media for further updates. The Ballyfermot Dog Show in the new "People's Park" on 25th June was a huge success with 100 entries. The Chapelizod dog show on 9th July was equally successful with 56 entries. The Animal Welfare unit attend all shows and engage with all dog owners around dog fowl and responsible ownership.
