

APPLICATION FOR OUTDOOR EVENT LICENCE

Event: St Patrick's Festival 2023

Eamon O'Boyle and Associates on behalf of St Patrick's Festival is applying to Dublin City Council for a Licence to hold a variety of events as part of St Patrick's Festival at multiple sites in Dublin City in accordance with part XVI of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended) and the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended).

This Licence application comprises of a variety of events to celebrate the St. Patrick's Festival, over the period 15th March – 19th March 2023 (inclusive). The proposed events are as follows:

- **St Patrick's Day Parade on 17th March 2023** from Northside of city to the Southside of city
- **Festival Quarter – Venue TBC**, Thursday 16th – Saturday 18th March, 2023
 - Over 2 and half days, during the St. Patrick's Festival, a city centre venue will be transformed into a family friendly event hub including a Céilí (over one afternoon/evening). The Festival Quarter will be split into a day time event for families and a younger audience with night time music and cultural events at night time for a more mature audience (18s over only). There will be a combination of free and paid ticketed events
- **Funfair at Custom House Quay** 16th, 17th, 18th & 19th March 2023
- **Céilí – venue TBC**
- **Ancillary events** – various events held around the city centre

The application for licence may be inspected at the offices of Dublin City Council during office hours for a period of Three weeks from the date of receipt of the application by Dublin City Council.
