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SOUTH WEST INNER CITY ELECTORAL AREA

Public Realm & Capital Programmes



Newmarket Interim Pedestrian Improvement Measures – Improved pedestrian facilities are now in place at Newmarket including widened footpaths, a reduction of parking, traffic calming and new crossing points. Additional work to be undertaken in the coming months includes final surface finish, the addition of tree planters and other street furniture. Pay parking will now be in place for the various areas of parking on Newmarket and adjoining streets.

Meath Street Public Realm Improvement Scheme – A tender call for the construction phase of this public realm project is expected to issue in Q2/25 with work expected to commence later this year. Advance work to underground water mains on the street are currently being scheduled by Uisce Éireann.

Iveagh Markets – The tender for the next stage of works in Iveagh Markets was published 06.03.25 following the approval of both Corporate Project Support Office and the Department of Housing in relation to the Urban Regeneration Development Fund funding stream. (Closing date is 17th April) Site visits with contractors took place on Friday 14th March and Tuesday 18th March.

Bridgefoot Street Park – Parks & Landscape Services will be installing additional play features, lighting and repair of planted areas in coming weeks.

Tenters Greening – The Parks, Biodiversity and Landscape Services team will be continuing landscaping work in The Tenters in the coming weeks including:

- 1. Clarence Mangan Road and Greenville Avenue Junction
- 2. Petrie and Gilbert Road Junction
- 3. Merton and Donore Avenue Junction
- 4. Clarence Mangan Road

At each location, the paving will be removed, trees and herbaceous perennial planting will added. In the order of 20 trees will be planted, using a native and ornamental species including Magnolia, Betula, Pinus and Amelanchier. Work will commence in mid-March.

Dolphin's Barn Street Tree Planting (Phase 2) – civil works to facilitate 15 no. planned street tree planting in buildouts on Haroldville Avenue, Reuben Street and Saint Anthony's Road will proceed in May, with the trees themselves planted later in the year. This project is being undertaken by Parks & Landscape Services.



Liffey Quay Walls — a programme of cleaning of approx. 6km of granite quays walls has now been completed. Additional painting and the removal of damaged and redundant lighting columns will be completed in coming months. This has been a coordinated action of the three local area offices bounding the river.

City Walls - A major programme of repair of Dublin's historic city wall at Cook Street was completed in February. The work included the removal of invasive vegetation, extensive repointing, rebuilding

of buttresses and repair of St Audoen's Arch. The project was support funded by the Community Monuments Fund.



Economic Development

Shopfront Improvement Scheme 2025 –

The 2025 edition of this grants scheme is currently advertised. The scheme is open to businesses across the SWIC area and provides supporting grants up to a maximum of €3,000 to assist with the refurbishment or upgrading of shop and business fronts. More details at www.dublincity.ie.

Smart D8— Smart D8 is a health and community wellbeing demonstrator project that is support by Dublin City Council through the Area Office and Smart Dublin. Smart D8 has now launched its fifth pilot call, seeking innovative projects that address health and well-being challenges in the community, trialling in the Dublin 8 area. More at www.smartd8.ie.

Marrowbone Lane Site – The project team commenced initial consultations by meeting with Dublin City Council service managers to establish the operational service requirements for the site. This work has taken more time than expected and requires further consideration by the relevant departments. Once this work is completed, the project team will reach out to community stakeholders to arrange consultations. Relevant community and sporting groups will be contacted when firm dates are known. Jamie Cudden, Executive Manager, Corporate Services & Transformation is taking over as project lead from Darach O'Connor who is moving to a new role in Planning, Property and Economic Development.

Kilmainham Inchicore Network - next meeting: 31 March 2025 5.30pm

At the February KIN meeting, a presentation about FUNAFLOAT, proposed community boat project for the Grand Canal, was given by Reg Mc Cabe. All members shared information about what was going on in their areas.

KIN briefly discussed Local Area Plan/Village Improvement Plan for Inchicore/Kilmainham as outlined in the Dublin City Development Plan 2022-2028, further discussion will take place at KIN March meeting.

KIN Education and Lifelong Learning committee workshop will take place Monday 8th April 12 noon at CD ETB Inchicore College. This facilitated workshop will discuss and determine the purpose, remit and deliverables of the subcommittee. All local Education and Life Long learning professionals are invited to attend.

Housing

Sarah Place

After a successful meeting with the residents' association, several issues were raised, including parking and lighting. In response, the Project Estate Officer arranged for the installation of "Parking for Residents Only" signs and reported faulty lights within the complex, which were subsequently repaired.

Thomas Court Bawn / School Street



A successful regeneration information session was held with members of the Design Team, Metropolitan Workshop, and staff from the Dublin City Council area office. During the event, proposals were discussed, and attendees had the opportunity to share their views. The session was well attended, and the overall response was highly positive.

In preparation for the regeneration works, BHP was contracted to conduct structural assessments and additional asbestos testing. These investigations took place in two vacant properties and were facilitated by the Project Estate Officer.

Clinic

We run the clinic every Wednesday morning, with a colleague from the rents team available to assist.

Water pressure

Engineers have conducted an assessment and found no issues or leaks. However, small pumps may need to be installed in some of the accommodations.

Windows upgrade

Windows installation project - the contractor is continuing work on installing the windows.

Gutters cleaning

DCC has begun cleaning and carrying out repairs as needed.



Choice Based Lettings

We are currently processing the CBLs and are pleased to report that several transfers within the complex are being successfully managed.

Bonham Court

Dublin City Council and Sisk are conducting handover inspections. Sisk will be carrying out some minor works. Additionally, a new fob system has been installed on the courtyard doors.





Robinson's Court

The installation of the new security gate for pedestrians and vehicles is complete and will be commissioned shortly.



Dolphin House Clinic

A weekly clinic is held every Wednesday from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. at the Dolphin House Community Centre.

Meanwhile Use Project

A Meanwhile Use project is being proposed for land not immediately required for housing development. A small MUGA (Multi-Use Games Area) will be installed next to the children's play area near the Dolphin Community Centre. Landscaping and greening of the old soccer pitch will take place, along with the installation of walkways and seating. A horticultural area, featuring a small greenhouse, will also be created. The new

amenities are expected to be available for community use by the second half of June.

Herberton

Clinic

Weekly clinic being held on Thursdays 10am-12noon in the F2 centre.

Clean-Up Operation at F2 Pitch

A special clean-up operation has been undertaken around the boundary area of the pitch in front of the F2 which has become a littering blackspot.



Security Enhancements

The local area office is working with Lansdowne Property Management to enhance the security and durability of the communal doors in Block D.

Additionally, an assessment of the overall security in the Herberton complex will be conducted by the Estate Management team in Eblana House, in collaboration with An Garda Síochána, the Crime Prevention Officer at Kevin St, and Lansdowne Property Management. The recommendations from this review will be considered to improve overall security within the complex.

Basin Street

Graffiti removal

PPP Project – Basin View Complex

Planning permission has been approved, and Basin Street has been given detenanting priority status, with Dublin City Council prioritizing tenants in the first two blocks. Dublin City Council has met with the residents' group to inform them of this development. The first family from these two blocks has signed for a new property.



Community Participation team

Community Festivals

The Community Development team are supporting the following festivals.

Cherry Blossoms

The festival programme and launch date will be finalised this week. And a huge variety of events and fun days will take place across Cherry Orchard from the 01/04/25 – 30/04/25.

Ballyfermot Arts Festival

The dates for this festival are 19th – 27th of July. The first open meeting for the festival was held in the Ballyfermot civic centre with lots of brainstorming and new ideas teased out in a workshop format.

Walkinstown Festival

The Walkinstown festival will take place on the 31st of August this year the community

team have met with the festival committee to discuss the plans for it.

Chapelizod Festival

Initial meetings have taken place with the festival organising committee and the new Community team are excited to help with the planning and continue the support for Chapelizod. Dates for the festival are 28th of June to the 6th of July.

Drimnagh Festival

The new community team are continuing to introduce themselves to the local area groups and committees and have met with Dynamic Drimnagh to discuss the plans for not only the festival, but how the team can continue to support groups and the great work they do.

International Women's Day

For International Women's Day the Community Team put together mini 'survival kits' to distribute to a number of women's groups in the area including groups that meet in the Blue Dorr, Saint Mathews Family Resource Centre and to women working in the area, such as the Ballyfermot Civic Centre.

Sheltered Housing Complexes


Community Staff are working with the older peoples groups to once again encourage activities in the Common Rooms.

The introduction of the new community team to the wider area continues with two coffee mornings on the 18th of March where the team in conjunction with Dublin City Libraries will inform residents of ongoing activities in the area. The community team will work closely with Familibase to roll out their Unsung Youth Music Event to make sure this event has as wide a reach as possible.

Pride 2025

The Community Team are in the early stages of planning events to celebrate Dublin Pride, Bród Átha Cliath 2025 in conjunction with Ballyfermot Youth Service and the Ballyfermot Civics Centre.

AGE Friendly Programme

The Age Friendly Programme of events for the Ballyfermot area began on the 28th of January and will run every week until 25th March. Activities range from Bingo, Line Dancing, Health talks and two tea dances. Having consulted with participants we decided to introduce a Thai Chi session to the program which was extremely well attended, and requests were made for this to be a staple of the program. To celebrate International Women's Day, we will be holding a Sound bath and meditation workshop as part of the program.





Tai Chi with Eugene Banks was a huge success on the 18th of February.

Together FM Film Club

Together FM in partnership with the Dublin City Community Development Team are screening the second film in this joint initiative Life's a Breeze on Thursday 13th March @ 10.30am in the Ballyfermot Civic Centre.



Labre Park Playground launch

The community team are working in close conjunction with BTAP and relevant departments within Dublin City Council to formally launch the new playground in Labre Park. A date of 28th of March has been agreed on for the launch.

<u>Grants / Funding / Community /</u> Informal Adult Education Grants

2024 Community and Informal Adult Education Grants are currently in the process of being paid to the community groups. Awaiting dates for 2025 grants.

Public Domain

New Public Realm improvement works @ Parkwest Train Station



The Public Domain Office received a complaint regarding dilapidated large wooden planters on a section of the Cherry Orchard & Park West Train Station Plaza. A member of the public reported these unsightly old wooden planters, that where collapsing, with weeds growing out of them, the trees that were within same where either broken or gone, and generally these planters were only being used as waste bins. The complainant had

queried if they could be repaired or replaced.

It was initial assumed this section of the Plaza, and subsequently the planters, where the responsibility of larnród Éireann. However following investigation it was determined that this section of the plaza was actually in Dublin City Council ownership, however this section of the plaza and the surrounding footpaths & road have not been taken into charge to date.





The Area Office has contacted Planning Department enquiring about this situation, highlighting the difficulties that it presents and requesting that this area including the road and footpaths be taken in charge.

Discussions have also been had with the Roads and Parks Department, who, once the area is in taken in charge, will maintain and carry out agreed remedial works.

It is hoped that this matter can be resolved shortly. This will allow this much needed

repair and maintenance works to take place at this strategical important site, which is located at the centre of the Strategic Development Regeneration Area, as identified under the City Development Plan. This area is also highlighted as an area where Public Realm improvement works are required under this plan.

In the interim, while we await this matter to be addressed, the Public Domain Office arranged for the dilapidated planter boxes to be removed, which revelled 4 pre-cut tree pit locations, we subsequently engaged a contractor to break out and excavate these tree pits and install 4 semi mature Betula Pendula Silver Birch trees.

Works also included the installation of granite grates for around the tree pits. The Public Domain specified these stylish and practical tree grille for this urban setting in mind. The design allows paving to be continued almost up to the tree trunk, protecting the trees root system from urban traffic and soil compaction but also allowing rainwater through to maximise irrigation and urban drainage. This was integrated with a Rootball Anchor Fixing System to ensure the tree routes, as they grow, do not lift the surrounding paving preventing the creation of any future potential trip hazards, as the tree grows.





Works commenced on Monday 3rd March and are due to be completed shortly.

Building on the success of previous cleanup days, Dublin City Council are again asking all residents, volunteers and community groups around Dublin city to join forces to organise a local clean-up event in their area. Let's get together to clean-up our streets, laneways, and canal walks and make Dublin a Fair City again.

We are seeking the assistance of all volunteer groups in the area to get them involved with the Team Dublin Clean-up day.

We will have the support of Waste Management Services, who will provided litter pick equipment, if groups don't already have them, and will collect and dispose of the bags of litter collected by each group. Waste Management Services will be Launching the Team-Dublin Clean-up day shortly and will advertise same on social media.

OPW - Hedge cutting

The Public Domain office, on foot of a complaint from a member of the public, recently engaged with the OPW with regard to overgrowth emanating from the Phoenix Park causing a hazard for cyclists and pedestrians alike using the footpath along Chapelizod Road. The OPW have confirmed that they have engaged a contractor to carry out these works but where awaiting a licence to start works. OPW have now confirmed that these works will commence the week starting the 10th March.

Storm Éowyn

As reported last month the hoarding around the Development site on Chapelizod Main Street came down during storm Éowyn.

The Public Domain Office arranged for the Roads emergency team to clear the road and footpath of the fallen hoarding, to ensure the road was safe for road users and pedestrians immediately after the storm.

However the remaining hoarding, surrounding the site, which collapsed onto the community garden area, left the development site exposed and an unsightly mess in the heart of the village.

The Public Domain Office contacted the Development Department requesting that they remove the old hoarding and reinstate hoarding around the site as soon as possible.





I am delighted to advise members that the new hoarding has been erected.





Illegal Kerb dishing/depositing of material on a Public Road

As reported last month report the Public Domain Office have commenced a survey of the illegal practice, by some households in the Ballyfermot Drimnagh Area, of depositing material on a public road creating illegal kerb dishing on public roads. This has been done by depositing concreate, tarmacadam, and concrete cill's, wooden planks or some other material, onto the public roadway, to create a ramp to facilitate access for off street parking in their front gardens. This is not only affecting the character and amenity of the areas streetscapes, and detracting from the visual character of the area, it is also creating a very serious hazard for other motorist's pedestrians, and cyclists.





This survey has now been completed and we have identified **452** instances of household's illegally depositing material onto a public road. We now intend to write to each household requesting that they remove these illegal materials, within a set period otherwise enforcement action will be taken, this will include DCC Roads Maintenance Section removing these materials, the cost of which may be sought to be recovered via the courts.

Under the Roads Act 1993, Section 13, it is an offence to place or deposit any material or thing on a public road. The Local Authority can remove any material, thing or remove or reduce any hazard, potential hazard, obstruction on a road or footpath and can recover from such person, as a simple contract debt in any court of competent jurisdiction, any costs reasonably incurred. Fines up to €5,000 and or imprisonment of up to 6 months can be faced for failure to comply with these obligations.

At the same time we will also inform and advise the householders of what appropriate action they can take if they wish to maintain an access to their driveways. Including the planning process

and the application process for official kerb dishing, with our Roads Department.

Oranmore Road Speed Ramps approved

The Public Domain Office is delight to inform members that a request for additional speed ramps have been recommended for Oranmore Road, by the Transport Advisory Group. The Public Domain Office requested TAG carry out a review of this location, including a speed survey, following complaints received from local residents and local representatives.

<u>Graffiti Removal – Glenaulin Park on</u> Drumfinn Avenue

Public Domain Office engaged contractors to remove of graffiti from walls on Cherry Orchard Green.
