1 SCHEME OVERVIEW

Dublin City Council (DCC), with the support of the National Transport Authority (NTA), plan to upgrade 1.1km of pedestrian, cycling and bus stop facilities along North Circular Road (NCR) and Portland Row. The scheme starts at the junction of North Circular Road and Dorset Street

at the junction of North Circular Road and Dorset Street Lower and ends at the junction of Portland Row and Amiens Street.

The scheme forms part of Dublin's 314km Active Travel Network. It connects the existing segregated cycle tracks on Amiens Street and North Strand Road with the proposed Swords to City Centre BusConnects route at Dorset Street Lower.

2 PREVIOUS PROGRESS


From December 2022 to January 2023, DCC carried out a public consultation for a temporary scheme along the same route. The temporary scheme did not include upgrades to junctions or improvements to the footpaths.

3 KEY FEATURES & BENEFITS

This scheme will provide many benefits for you and your community including:

- Footpath widening at existing narrow sections/pinch points
- Localised footpath / roadway repairs
- Safer, upgraded junctions with better crossing facilities for pedestrians and cyclists
- Continuous footpaths across side roads to improve pedestrian priority
- **6 new bus stops** to facilitate planned orbital bus route
- Segregated cycle lanes in both directions
- Additional planting and green spaces
- Changes to vehicle access and reduction in 'through traffic' on Sherrard Street Lower, Sherrard Street Upper, Belvedere Road and Emmet Street
- Changes in car parking to improve safety
- Improved driver visibility from side roads

4 CHANGES TO VEHICLE ACCESS AT JUNCTIONS

To improve pedestrian and cyclist safety at junctions, the project proposes to change how vehicles access the following streets:

Sherrard Street Lower: Vehicles will no longer be able to access Sherrard Street Lower from North Circular Road. Vehicular access will be via Portland Street North and Portland Place, as shown in Figure 1.

Sherrard Street Upper: Vehicles will no longer be able to access Sherrard Street Upper from North Circular Road. Vehicular access will be via Belvedere Place, Mountjoy Square North and Gardiner Street Upper, as shown in Figure 1. Sherrard Street Upper will change to a two-way road.

Belvedere Place: The left-hand slip lane from North Circular Road to Belvedere Place will be removed. There will be no left turn from North Circular Road to Belvedere Place. Access to Belvedere Place for vehicles travelling from the east will be via Fitzgibbon Street, as shown in Figure 1. Vehicles will still be able to turn right onto Belvedere

Place from North Circular Road. Vehicles will also still be able to access Belvedere Place from Belvedere Road.

Emmet Street: Vehicles will no longer be able to access Emmet Street from North Circular Road. Vehicular access will be via Charles Street Great, as shown in Figure 2. Emmet Street will change to a two-way road.
