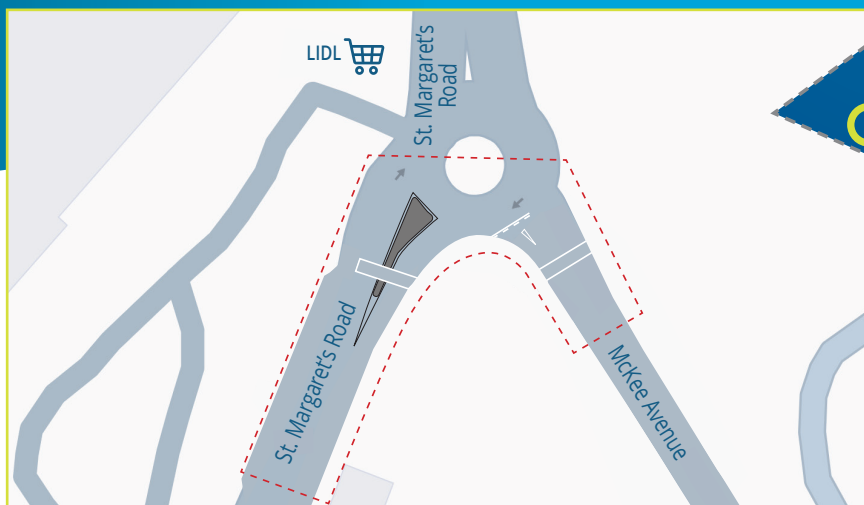


# St Margaret's Road/ McKee Avenue Roundabout

## Pedestrian Improvement Scheme PUBLIC CONSULTATION

5th August-1st September



Dublin City Council (DCC), with the support of the National Transport Authority (NTA), propose to enhance pedestrian safety and accessibility at St Margaret's Road/McKee Avenue Roundabout by installing new signalised pedestrian crossings on the southwestern arm (St Margaret's Road) and the southeastern arm (McKee Avenue) of the roundabout. This will increase safety for pedestrians and vulnerable road users and improve access to the bus stops on McKee Ave and St Margaret's Rd.

This junction is part of the 314km Dublin Active Travel Network.

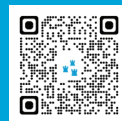
