# SOUTH WEST INNER CITY ELECTORAL AREA

### **Public Realm & Capital Programmes**

**Meath Street Public Realm Improvement Scheme** – Advance works by the utility Uisce Éireann to renew underground water infrastructure on Meath Street are continuing. Due to the complexity of these works, it is now expected that the main paving works will commence at the start of 2026.

**Dolphin's Barn Street Trees** – work continues on street tree planting at a number of locations in Dolphin's Barn including St Anthony's Road, Haroldville Avenue and Reuben Street. The main civil works will be completed later this month, while tree planting will take place later in the year when conditions allow.

**Vicar Street Parklet** – a contractor has now been appointed to undertake refurbishment of the small playground beside Mallin House to create a new parklet. It is hoped to commence work in October/November.

**Public Seating Installations** – installation of new seats and public benches at 12 locations across SWIC will commence shortly. Locations have been chosen where the seats offer a respite on long streets or at public transport stops. These seats are an Age Friendly initiative and support funded by the Discretionary Fund.

**The Iveagh Market** – an announcement of the preferred contractor for planned emergency stabilisation and roof renewal work to the markets will be made in due course. The current expectation is to commence site work towards the end of the year.

### Housing

### **Emmet Crescent**

Planters have been restored and brightened up with fresh flowers.

### **Choice Based Lettings**

Three properties in Emmet Crescent have been let through Choice Based Lettings.

### **Tyrone Place / Emmet Crescent**

The annual Family Fun Day, organised in partnership with the Family Resource Centre, took place on 17th July. This year, due to development works on Vincent Street West, the event was relocated to the National School grounds. The day was a great success, with the smaller setting creating a warmer and more enjoyable atmosphere compared to the larger field on Vincent Street.

### **Choice Based Lettings**

Two properties in Tyrone Place have been let through Choice Based Lettings.

### **Coombe Court**

The tenant was unable to maintain the front garden. Sundrive Road Depot staff assisted by cutting back the overgrowth and restoring the area to good condition.

### **Herberton - Clinic**

### **Dolphin House - Clinic**

A weekly clinic is held every Wednesday from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. at the Dolphin House Community Centre.

### **Braithwaite Street**

Storm damage caused a large branch to fall from a mature oak tree, exposing internal decay. A significant crack was also identified along the side of the tree, and an arborist deemed it unsafe.

### **Oliver Bond House - Clinic**

The weekly clinic takes place every Wednesday from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. in the Robert Emmet Centre, in collaboration with our colleagues from Housing Rents.

### **Choice Based Lettings**

Properties are currently being viewed following nominations from Housing Allocations.

### **Windows Upgrade**

The windows project at Oliver Bond House is now substantially complete. External snagging remains and is expected to be finished within the next two weeks, weather permitting.

### **Emmet Buildings**

The playground refurbishment is complete, and improvements have also been made to the surrounding grounds.

Utility works installing new and diverting existing services on Patriots Path and St Vincent

Street West ongoing. There are several individual contractors on behalf of Gas Networks, ESB, OpenEir and Uisce Éireann working on-site in parallel with Hegarty. Co-ordination of works is difficult with limited advance notification from utility companies, including works scheduled at weekends.

Utility contractors are responsible to advise businesses and residents in advance. Hegarty advise the IRCF monthly of scheduled works. Branding artwork for site hoarding on Emmet Road will be installed over the coming weeks. Concluding the tender evaluation for the main construction contract. The preferred contractor will be identified in due course.

### 25 years - 25 Play Streets (Sunday 21st September 2025, 1pm- 4pm) Car Free Day Event

The community and social development team is supporting Dublin City Council's *25 Years – 25 Play Streets* initiative on Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> September (1pm – 4pm) in seven locations across Dublin 8. To compliment *Car Free Day* and in collaboration with local communities, these events will serve to promote informal play such as cycling, scooting, and traditional games like hopscotch. ### **Donore Avenue/Margaret Kennedy Road Summer Project**

This summer, the community team played a key role in supporting the Donore Avenue/Margaret Kennedy Road summer project. In partnership with the SWIC HSE health worker, the team helped deliver a variety of activities and outings for 33 children and young people from the Donore area.

The project was a great success, and the team is excited to support future summer initiatives in Donore, with the continued involvement of the SWIC community development team. This collaboration also marked a positive step in building relationships between the new DCC community development worker and residents and families locally.



# Summer in the Bond - Engagement Programme - A Step Towards a Revived Voluntary Summer Project

The community and social development team's summer calendar collaborated with the Oliver Bond residents' group with the aim of reintroducing a voluntary, resident-led summer project in Oliver Bond. As a result, a programme of 11 activities took place, engaging more than 60 individual children and culminating in a community celebration attended by over 100 residents.

The programme served as a valuable engagement tool - encouraging residents, with the support of DCC and *Crosscare*, to consider taking an active role in planning a voluntary summer project for 2026. In addition, this pilot marks a positive and promising step forward in building stronger relationships, fostering positive collaboration, and promoting local leadership within the Oliver Bond community, in partnership with DCC and the community and social development team.



### **Grant Writing Workshop**

In association with Dublin South City Partnership, a Grant Writing Workshop will take place on Wednesday, 24th September at St. Andrew's Community Centre, Rialto. This is a great opportunity for community groups who are struggling with grant applications to learn the skills of effective grant writing and discover new funding opportunities.







The day itself took place on the 23/08/25 and was well attended by residents of Bluebell and gave the team a great chance to sit and talk with attendees who were there on the day.

On the same day Bluebell also hosted its first 'Bio-Blitz'. Organised by Waterways Ireland and supported by Dublin City Council it gave participants a chance to explore the stretch of canal from Bluebell to Kylemore and along with a team of Bio-Diversity experts help count and record the many native flora and fauna located along the canal.

### Wonderful Walkinstown Festival / Opera in the Park

Once again, many Walkinstown residents came out to support the work carried out by the Wonderful Walkinstown Festival Committee in putting together this festival on Sunday 31/08/25.

Several services including Familibase and Liffey Partnership had the opportunity to link with families and get them signed up for programmes and activities taking place in the coming months. Children were able to sign up for the library on the day and take books there and then.

During the Summer we The Orchard community centre were delighted to be recognised as an Autism friendly champion by 'AS I AM'.

As part of the summer events, the staff from the centre were delighted to support & participate in the family fun day in Cherry Orchard, which coincided with the Ballyfermot/Cherry Orchard Arts festival. This was followed up by a photo exhibition of Cherry Orchard, then & now along with a music session by the men's shed.

**The Bluebell Community Council** (BCC) was formed in 2017 to give the people of Bluebell a strong collective voice in shaping their areas future. Its main purpose is to coordinate between residents, community groups, schools and local services whilst also advocating for the delivery of essential facilities in the community.

The BCC is chaired by Senator Aubrey McCarthy with Tommy Coombes serving as coordinator and is also manager of the Bluebell Community Development project (CDP).

Made up of 32 members representing a broad cross-section of the community the BCC provides a platform for local people to have an influence on development plans and ensure that regeneration projects meet the needs of both future and current residents.

### **Dynamic Drimnagh**

Dublin City Council's "Opera in the Park" at Good Counsel Liffey Gaels GAA Club took place on August 22<sup>nd</sup>. Dynamic Drimnagh extends its gratitude to the South-Central Area Community Development staff for organising the event.

In other community news, St. John Bosco Youth Centre will now serve as a convenient local drop-off point for small electrical waste, eliminating the need for residents to travel outside the community for recycling services.

We would like to announce that Petrogas Group Limited, operating as Applegreen, has generously awarded Dynamic Drimnagh €1,995 in community funding. This funding will be used to install a new bench in Errigal Park, further enhancing the recently upgraded area. We have contacted DCC Parks & Biodiversity regarding the installation.

The Drimnagh Historical Group is actively utilising the podcast facility at St. John Bosco to record interviews with residents, building a comprehensive catalogue of Drimnagh's social history since its expansion in 1932-1933. Cathy Scuffil is collaborating with the group to document the history of local community buildings over the decades.

Dynamic Drimnagh is currently reviewing the Drimnagh 2030 Plan. Upon completion, the revised report will be distributed to Dublin City Council, elected Councillors in both Local Electoral Areas, and the Dublin South City Partnership.

### **Ballyfermot Civic Centre - Health & Wellbeing Hub**

The Health & Wellbeing Hub, established by the Ballyfermot Community Civic Centre (BCCC) and funded by *Sláintecare* Healthy Ireland, continues to promote health and happiness within the community. The Hub offers a wide range of free activities including yoga, *Men on the Move*, Fitness Instruction, Sound Bath and ParkHIIT.

To support participation, essential equipment such as yoga mats, healthy food options, and sports watches were provided. In addition, 500 Gym & Swim passes were distributed to organisations working with people in addiction recovery and their families, ensuring wider access to recreational facilities. Classes take place in the Ballyfermot community civic centre daily.



### **Fit Fest**

Funded by Healthy Ireland who have supported the installation of water fountains in the people park. Fit Fest 2025 was collaboration between Ballyfermot community civic centre, Familibase, and DCC Sports Partnership built on the activities of the Health & Wellbeing Hub by transforming the People's Park into a vibrant, family-friendly market and fitness festival.

- The event opened with an invigorating ParkHIIT session, followed by a community breakfast and family fun run.
- A diverse programme of activities included Irish dancing, step aerobics, yoga, a sound bath, rickshaw rides, boxing sessions, and the ever-popular activator class, captivating audiences of all ages.
- Music and dance created a lively and inclusive atmosphere, ensuring an event that celebrated fitness, community, and wellbeing.

# The Lawns (Le Fanu Park) - Park railings painting completed

Public Domain is delighted to inform members that essential maintenance of the Le Fanu Park railing which was rusted and corroded, has now been addressed. The condition of the railings was raised at several of the community forums, both by local reps and residents alike over the last couple of years. The park railings have now been repainted, 663 bays of railings were cleaned rust primer applied and then two coats black *hammerite*, these works were funded through the Public Domain office.



Anti-Dumping initiative – Free Mattress Recycling Collection for Ballyfermot Drimnagh LEA The Ballyfermot Drimnagh Public Domain Office's Anti-Dumping initiative which offered a free Mattress Recycling collection to all households in the Ballyfermot Drimnagh Area was a resounding success.

Over 140 households participated in the scheme with 200 old mattresses collected & recycled instead of going to land fill or potential worse, being illegal dumped or burned.

The aim of any Anti-Dumping initiative is to reduce incidents of illegal dumping and increase awareness of alternatives to dumping including ways which supporting the Circular Economy. This Anti-Dumping initiative was aimed at addressing that problem, by way of prevention, and education of alternatives.

This initiative also looked to raise awareness of the Councils Bulky Waste Collection Service, a corporate initiative to alleviate illegal dumping. Education and awareness continue to play a key role in encouraging long-term behavioural change. There was a noticeable increase in requests for Bulky Waste Collections in the area. This initiative helped inform and

increase awareness of the importance of recycling and highlight that there are alternatives to illegal dumping.



### **Hedge cutting – Road & footpath safety**

Since the 1st September, land owners can now resume/carry out essential maintenance of their land including cutting, felling, lopping, trimming or removing a tree, shrub, hedge or other vegetation on their land, to stop it being a hazard to people using a public road or footpath- people can find out more about these rules in section 70 of the Roads Act 1993.





The idea is to use existing benches across the city and earmark them as Irish Language Chat Benches to help get more people speaking Irish across the city.



### **New Dog Fouling Stencilling Campaign**

The Public Domain put forward several locations to be included in the Waste Managements, Litter Management office campaign to raise awareness of dog owners' responsibility to pick up after their dogs. The Public Domain Office identified 9 locations across the Ballyfermot Drimnagh area, all of which were outside schools in the area as children are those most at risk from dog fouling.



### AGE FRIENDLY IRELAND (AFI) Programme SCA

This new section of the Director of Services Report will cover all aspects of Age Friendly Initiatives in the DCC SCA.

Aoife Hannan has taken up the role of Age Friendly Ireland Programme Manager for the DCC SCA, coordinating the initiative across the SCA. Both Community and Social Development Teams across the SCA met during the Summer to discuss a strategic approach to AFI such that consistency, equity and equal opportunities are available to all our older persons living in SCA to engage in the programme.

### **Older Person's Council (OPC)**

Over the next few months, a SCA Older Person's Council (OPC) will be established. Older People's Councils are established in every local authority area of Ireland under the local Age Friendly programme. They are a vehicle to bring the voice of older people into local government and help to inform private and public service provision. An awareness campaign is currently being planned that will be shared with local councillors. The outcome will lead to an OPC AGM event being held in January 2026.

### **Healthy Age Friendly Homes Programme**

For your information the Local Co-Ordinator, Healthy Age Friendly Homes Programme, SCA Dublin City Council is Naomi Dixon (Naomi,dixon@dublincity.ie). The SCA community and social development teams are facilitating Naomi to speak with older persons, in particular those living in DCC older person complexes, to discuss the healthy homes programme. To date Claddagh Court, Riverview Court have been visited by Naomi.

### **Positive Ageing Week 2025**

A joint initiative approach has been taken by the SCA Community and Development Teams to promote positive ageing initiatives; celebrating older adults through community-led events, across the SCA during Positive Ageing Week 2025 29th September to 3rd October. Voluntary groups and local services will take part in activities promoting wellbeing, inclusion, and visibility.

To support participation, both Community and Social Development teams in the SCA have arranged a bursary to help volunteers and community group initiatives focused on reducing social exclusion, fostering intergenerational connections, celebrating older people's contributions, and challenging age-related stereotypes. A poster will be shared widely promoting the events.



### August 2025 Report of Activities, Historian in Residence Project Cathy Scuffil, Historian in Residence (HIR) Dublin City Council (DCC) South Central Area (SCA)

HIR continues regular contact with DCCs Social and Community Development (SACD) Teams, Dublin City Libraries, and local history, heritage, community and cultural groups in the area. History talks have been held for the Drimnagh Sister and Women's Sheds groups, and Dolphin House community as part of the Rialto Arts Festival. A blogpost 'Daniel's Dates with Dublin 8' was provided to Culture Date with Dublin 8 to commemorate the 250th birth-anniversary of Daniel O'Connell. Other HIR projects included a speech at Boulevard Bloom in Cow Parlour (Bloom's Day), a talk for the Chapelizod Festival and attendance at the Ballyfermot Heritage Day. Recordings included a broadcast on Lyric FM centred on the Marsalsea Barracks, Thomas Street, supporting the ongoing exhibition in the Irish Architectural Archive, a programme on Together FM (Ballyfermot) and the Claire Byrne Show (RTE Radio 1) discussing 'The House of Guinness' Netflix series.

History on Your Doorstep (vol 8) was launched in City Hall by Lord Mayor, Councillor Ray McAdam. My chapter in this edition centred on Flanagan's Fields Community Garden in Reuben Street, Dolphin's Barn and the story of the man behind the name.
