PROJECTS UNIT, NORTH EAST INNER CITY

Liberty Park Crèche

Davencrest Ltd. T/A Kids Inc operate a full services Crèche on behalf of Dublin City Council at Liberty Park Crèche, Foley Street. The contract is for a period of three years effective from the 1st June 2012 with an option to extend the contract for a further one or two years should finances permit.

There are currently 30 children attending the crèche on a full time basis.

Liberty Corner - Disposal of Nine Retail Units

Five of the units have been disposed of, and there are four remaining units. Lisneys were marketing the remaining units for lease however there was very little interest in the letting of the units. The Council's Development Department have agreed to allow the Arts Office use the 2 larger units located on James Joyce Street for cultural type use.

Units 6 and 7 Liberty Corner Complex, James Joyce Street, Dublin 1 and a Unit in Sean Treacy House, Empress Place, Dublin 1

Following an Expressions of Interest exercise to offer units 6 and 7, Liberty Corner Complex and a unit in Sean Treacy House for community type use to local groups / projects, Tariqa Burhanyia are now in occupation of the unit in Sean Treacy House under a licence agreement. The Acts of Compassion Project Ltd are now in occupation of unit 6 in the Liberty Corner Complex under a licence agreement. Each unit required total fit-out and this was the responsibility of each successful applicant along with utility, rates and maintenance costs.

Unit 7, located in the Liberty Corner Complex is currently vacant.

Community Policing Fora Update

Meetings of Cabra and NWIC fora were held recently and the next meeting of the Navan Rd Forum is on Dec 13th. A recurring issue at the NWIC Forum is landlord properties on NCR. Updates were given by DCC on the work of the Environmental Section in conducting an extensive inspection programme on NCR and at Cabra Park. Residents were also advised that the Housing Regulations (Rented Properties Act 2008 and Amendment 2009) will come into effect for pre 63 properties from 1st Feb 2013.

The Gardai are targeting a number of properties that have been the subject of antisocial complaints and suspected criminal activity. They have notified landlords and called multi-agency meetings in September to discuss issues arising. DCC Environmental Health section attended.

Royal Canal Sub Group

We are currently organizing an open (Network) meeting next March for interested groups and individuals to raise their awareness of what is being done on the canal by Waterways Ireland, DCC and IWA and the sub group and to invite ideas and make contact with groups like anglers, walkers, residents etc. Public representatives will be notified and their participation welcomed at this event.

Broadstone Rail Line

Dumping on this line has been a recurrent problem particularly at the bridges at Cabra Rd and Connaught St. DCC have been working with residents and Irish Rail on this issue over recent years and Irish Rail have conducted a number of intensive clean ups of the line. Unfortunately the problem is getting worse with dumping reappearing very shortly after the most recent cleaning and Irish Rail have now installed a CCTV camera at the Cabra bridge.

Issue relating to surface water have been investigated thoroughly and it is believed that much of the problem is due to the poor natural drainage on the line. A long term solution is most likely to be put in place when the line is upgraded for the LUAS extension.

Pelletstown LAP

It is intended that a draft Local Area Plan will be presented to the Councillors in Quarter 2 2013. Subject to agreement by the Council, this draft Local Area Plan will be placed on public display for comment for a minimum of 6 weeks.

As it is likely that there will be alterations made to the Draft Local Area Plan after it comes off public display; these alterations will also need to be placed on public display and comments invited; thus completion of the Local Area Plan is likely to be no earlier than September 2013. This timeline reflects the legal requirements of making a local area plan, as described in the Planning & Development Acts 2000-2010.

Development Works

Smithfield Enhancement Scheme

Repair to the surface of the main plaza are completed. The bronze plaque was installed on the horse trough while the EU plaque was fixed to the wall of the facilities building. The project works are now complete.

Dunmanus Rd Senior Citizen Complex - proposal

Cluid Housing Association will be submitting a planning application for a complex in the grounds of the Church of the Most Precious Blood shortly. A presentation to local public representatives in advance of this was held at Cabra Area Office on 6th November. Cluid are also making contact with local residents representatives to advise them of the project.

Navan Rd and Cabra Swales

The final phase of re-planting of trees on the swales will commence shortly. This will enhance the green areas and help return them towards their previous role as amenities for residents. Lighting at the Drumcliffe rd swale has also been enhanced.

Tolka Valley Linear Park – River Rd

The engineering works are now complete and we are now progressing the final phase of the project. The landscape contractor has commenced works and will be completing the programme on schedule for a spring 2013 opening. These works will include final earthworks, seeding of lawns and wildflower meadows, planting of trees, hedges and bulbs, installation of signage and furniture.

Development Works - Other Agencies

Catholic Institute for Deaf People

The Institute €20m building programme at their site on Navan Rd /Ratoath Rd is well under way and a number of the new units are already open, including an office and shop by DeafHear, the hard of hearing support organization. Phase one is now complete.

Phases two and three will comprise the proposed amalgamation of the Cabra schools and residences for Deaf Boys and Girls and the moving of St. Joseph's House Brewery road from Stillorgan to Cabra to become part of the Deaf Village, together with new independent living facilities. Another aspect of the Village is the establishment of a Centre for Deaf Education managed jointly by Deafhear.ie, the IDS, CIDP, CDS Trinity College and the Deaf schools. The Centre is now set up and operating.

Royal Canal Bank - Painting Project

Due to the reallocation of a supervisor the project with e Probation Service has had to be suspended. However, contact had been established with another rex-offender programme, Jobcare, who have carried out an extensive refurbishment of the old Gardiner St labour exchange and it is hope that they will take on this project shortly.

HARP Community Gain

At the end December 2012, over €350,000 has been paid in Minor and Major grants to the 2011 applicants. All applicants must supply regular reports to the HARP office setting out the progress of the project and information on expenditure.

Community Development Update

December was a very busy month with community events taking place throughout the Central Area to celebrate the Christmas Season. All the events reported in the December Report went ahead and the weather held out. Drumalee Estate had two events, one for the Senior Citizens on Monday 17th and a Family Event in Aughtrim St. on the 19th. Both were well attended.

There has been a tremendous amount of support and good will from the volunteers and community groups in making the occasions a great success. Thanks is also due to the DCC Staff without whose co-operation and willingness to come on board, opening halls and lending equipment, things would have been much more difficult.

The forms for the Community Grants Scheme are now available and must be returned by 5pm on 31st January. Groups are being contacted and forms are being sent out at the moment.

North Inner City Housing Update

Matt Talbot Court

New roof tanks have been installed in one block. The other blocks will be examined in the new year to establish whether they need new tanks. Repairs to one roof completed and second roof currently being worked on.

Repairs to damaged play equipment have been completed and playground has been re-opened. Two residents have taken keys and are responsible for closing playground at night. Arrangements working at moment.

Liberty House (Peadar Kearney House)

DOEHLG has issued Budget Approval and permission to appoint contractor, Duggan Brothers Limited. Works are scheduled to commence in early January. The contract allows for a 114 week construction programme but Duggan Brothers are confident they can complete the works in a quicker period provided there are no unexpected delays. Access to the site will be via Railway Street only and as a result the street will be closed off at its midpoint but vehicular access to Liberty House, St. Mary's Mansions etc. will be maintained. It has been decided that the new development will be managed by Circle Housing Association.

St. Mary's Mansions

As a result of internal discussions around the future of St. Mary's Mansions, a decision has been made to transfer management and subsequently ownership of the complex to Cluid Housing Association. They have been requested to prepare a Feasibility Study on transfer of the complex by April 2013. Residents have been made aware of this development and Cluid officials intend meeting all residents on an individual basis in the New Year.

Patrick Heeney House and Crescent

Issues in relation to water ingress in the roof/terrace areas, in a small number of units, have emerged. City Architects are working with the Consultant Architect to clarify the exact nature of the problem with a view to getting the contractor, McCabes Ltd., back on site to address these issues. The matter has been complicated by McCabes Ltd. having entered into a receivership process. The Receivers (BDO) have not progressed this matter and City Architects now intend to appoint a contractor directly to carry out the works. The contractor will be paid from the remaining retention fees which had not been released to McCabes by City Architects.

Avondale House

Work commenced on site June 12th. There has been a delay in progress as a result of the necessity to carry out unforeseen works in the garden area. It is however likely that any delays encountered can be clawed and the project will be completed on time.

Alfie Byrne/Hill Street

Work commenced on site on March 12th with a works programme of 52 weeks. The majority of major construction/repairs works have now been completed. Unfortunately while the complex has been handed back to DCC by the contractor the ball play area remains unfinished. The surface required in the ball play area has been laid on two occasions but due to wet and cold weather this surface has lifted and cracked on both occasions. The contractor is now advising that he will require a sustained period of mild and dry weather in order to properly lay the surface. It is now likely that the ball play area will not be opened until February/March.

Father Scully House

Catholic Housing Aid Association (CHAS) have received approval and funding from the DOE to commence redevelopment of the site. The redevelopment will provide 100 social housing units for older persons. This will be comprised of 88 one bed units and 12 two bed units. CHAS have in the region of 35 tenants temporarily living in other complexes who are due to move back to the redeveloped complex. Construction commenced April 30th.

The Kiln/Forge

All works in relation to the gas flues has been completed by McKeon Brothers. All repair works required as a result of the gas flue works have now been completed by McKeon Brothers

Poplar Row, Taaffe Place, Annesley Avenue & Place – Pyrite Issue

Regular measurement is continuing and being monitored on a regular basis.

Croke Villas

There are now 13 dwellings out of a total of 79 occupied in the complex. The Estate Manager is liaising with the remaining individuals/families in trying to identify suitable accommodation in the areas they have requested. However, this process is becoming more difficult with the remaining families in Croke Villas being very specific in where they want to be accommodated. Regular meetings are taking place with the CPF, Residents and DCC.

A total of 12 offers of accommodation were made to tenants of the Croke Villas complex from January to December 2012 with five tenants accepting and seven refusals.

Ballybough House

Housing Maintenance Division is continuing to refurbish the void dwellings in the complex. A total of fifteen allocations were carried out in the complex from January to December 2012.

Housing Maintenance Division, Painting Crew will have completed all works in the complex by the end of January.

A contractor working on behalf of Dublin City Council carried out repair works to the CCTV in the complex and all 6 cameras are currently operational.

Courtney Place

The Ballybough Youth Project held its open day in 68/70 Courtney Place on 11th December 2012. A number of residents from the locality attended the open day.

Thomas Clarke House

A number of anti social incidents occurred in the complex over the weekend of 14th – 16th December 2012. NEIC Housing Staff are liaising with An Gardai Siochana and residents to investigate what measures can be taken to ensure that the remaining tenants in the complex do not suffer any further anti social behaviour.
