September to December

Draft Flood Risk Management Plans



This is the website for the **public consultation** on the **Draft Flood Risk Management Plans** ('Draft Plans') that are being produced by the Office of Public Works (OPW) and its partners in line with the **National Flood Policy** and the requirements of the **EU Floods Directive**.

The Draft Plans set out a range of proposed measures and actions to manage and reduce flood risk with the catchments and coastal reaches covered by each Draft Plan, focusing on the 300 areas of potentially significant flood risk around Ireland that were previously identified under the **Preliminary Flood Risk Assessment (PFRA)**. These areas are referred to under this programme as **Areas for Further Assessment (AFA)**.

The Draft Plans are now being published on a rolling basis for consultation. We would encourage you to review them and to make a submission setting out your views on their content. To facilitate this, a number of questions have been presented that you might consider responding to.

The Draft Plans make use of the information provided through the flood maps that have previously been produced under the CFRAM Programme and previous and parallel projects, and that were consulted upon in late 2015. The flood maps are currently being finalised, and are being made available online to view, when the Draft Plans are published for consultation.

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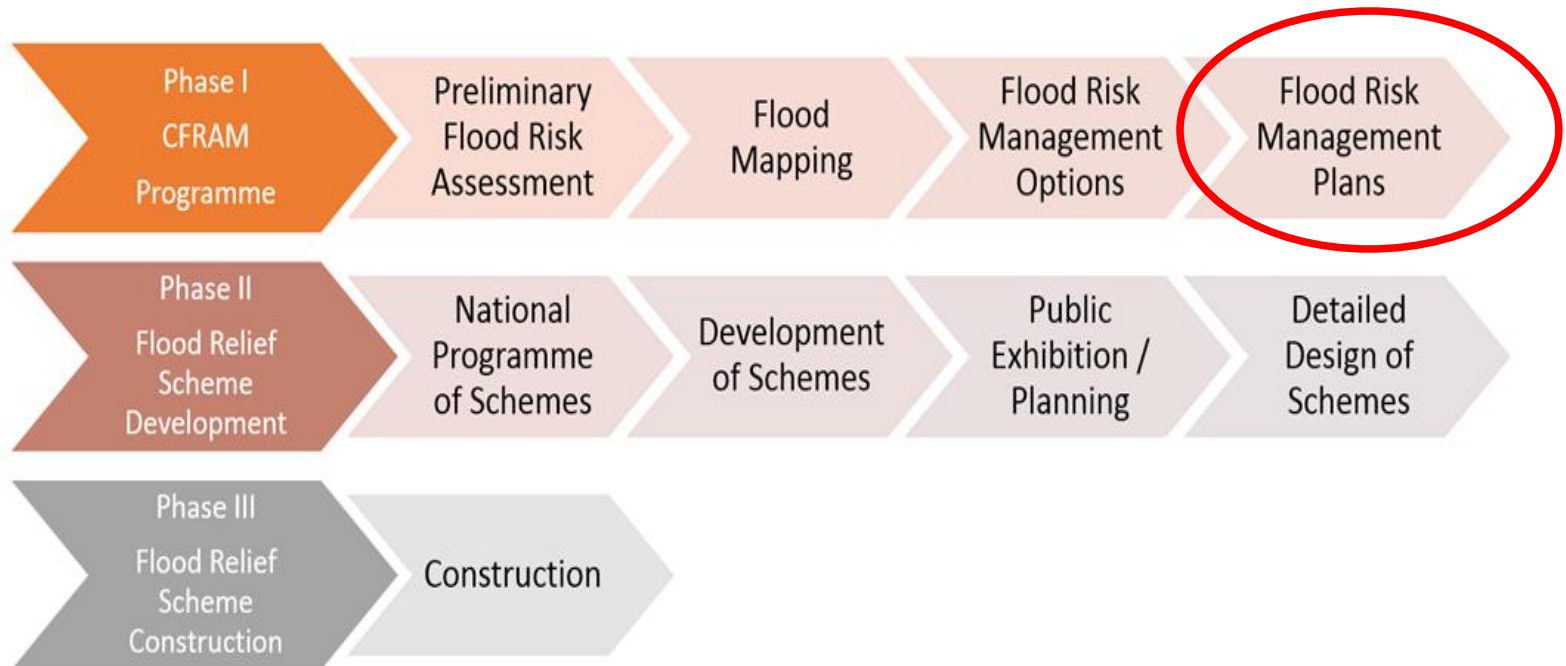
